

**PLAY** Instruments

Gather an aluminum pan, a piece of sandpaper, a wooden block and a large spoon. Play worship music. Encourage your child to tap the pan as he listens to the music. Guide him to try scraping the spoon on the sandpaper and tapping it on the wooden block. Mention that the people played trumpets, harps, and cymbals when they worshiped God in the temple.

**CLEAN** the Temple

Place this page in the bottom of a cardboard box. Cover the page with items like crumpled paper, empty cracker boxes, and empty juice bottles. Direct your child to pretend the box is the temple (church) and clean out the trash. Provide an empty trash bag to put the trash in. Read the Bible story (reverse side). Mention that the people cleaned the church so it was ready for worship. Encourage your child to draw on the outside of the box so it looks like a church.

**PLAY** Worship Music

Hold your baby and move and sing along with the worship music. Clap his hands gently to the rhythm of the music. Say: "We can worship God when we sing, play music, and pray." Whisper a prayer for your child and family.

2 CHRONICLES 29

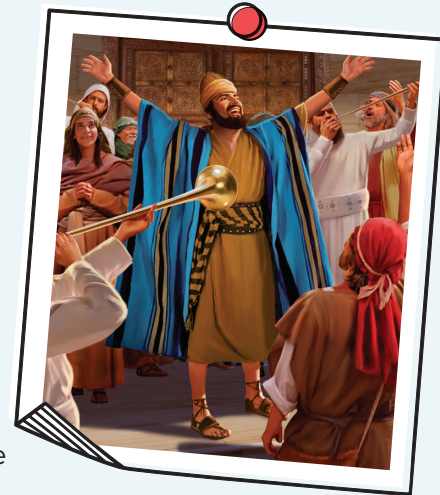
### Babies

Hezekiah was the king.

He told his helpers to clean the temple (church).

When the temple was clean, the king told all of the people to come to the temple.

The people came. They sang, played instruments, and praised God.



### 1s

King Hezekiah told the people to come to the temple (church) to help clean it. The people worked and worked until the temple was clean.

King Hezekiah told the people to come back to the temple.

The people worshiped (sang songs and played instruments) to show God they loved Him.

### 2s

King Hezekiah decided to clean and repair the temple (church). He told the people to come help clean.

The people did what the king said. They cleaned and cleaned.

Then they went to the king and told him they had finished the work.

The king told everyone to come to the temple to worship God. Worship means "to thank, praise, sing to, love, and obey God."

Hezekiah told the people to play their harps, cymbals and trumpets for a celebration.

Everyone at the temple listened while singers sang songs about God. The people were happy and worshiped God.

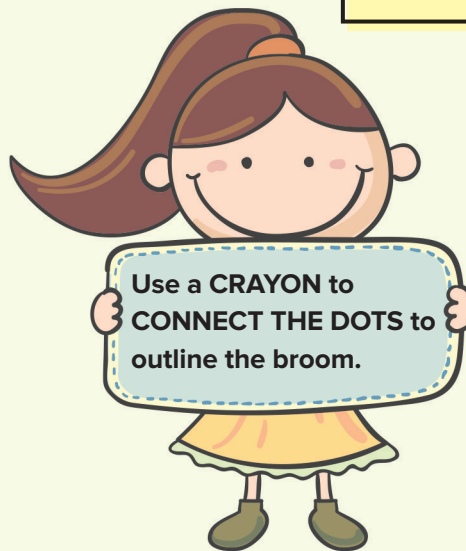

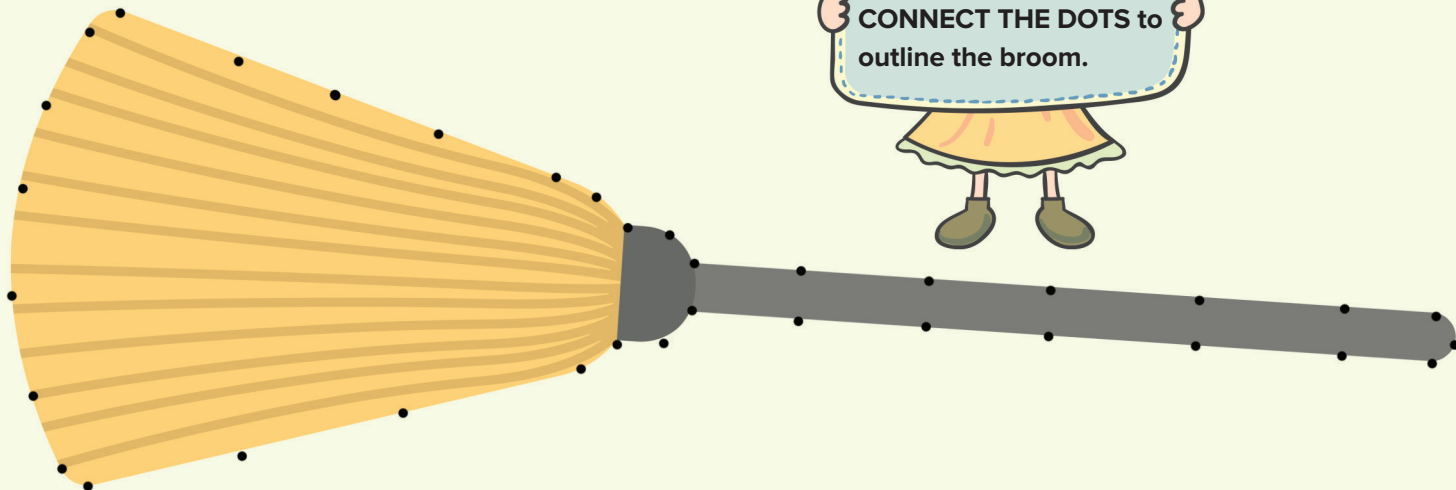

## Hezekiah and the People Worshiped

### 2 CHRONICLES 29

Jerusalem had a new king. His name was Hezekiah (HEZ ih high uh). Hezekiah loved and obeyed God. The king before Hezekiah had shut the doors of the temple. The people could not worship God together. Hezekiah wanted the people to worship God at the temple again. But first the temple needed to be cleaned and repaired.

King Hezekiah said to the special church helpers, “The temple is a special place to worship God.” He told them to clean the temple.

When the special helpers finished their work, they told the king, “We have cleaned the temple. Everything is ready for the people to come and worship God.”

## Hezekiah and the People Worshiped

### 2 CHRONICLES 29

Hezekiah (hez ih KIGH uh) became the new king when he was 25 years old. He was a good king and obeyed God, just as his ancestor, King David, had done.

In the very first month of King Hezekiah's reign, he ordered the temple to be cleaned. The priests opened the temple doors and began repairs. The temple helpers, the Levites, took all of the unholy and unclean things outside the city. Hezekiah said, "Our fathers were unfaithful. They abandoned God. It is in my heart to make a new promise to God to do things that please Him!"

The priests and temple helpers quickly began to work. They worked for 16 days to remove the unclean things from the temple and prepare it for worship. Then the helpers reported to the king, "We are finished. We have set up and dedicated everything that belongs in the temple."

Early in the morning, King Hezekiah went to the temple. He brought bulls, rams, lambs, and male goats for the priests to offer to God as sacrifices for the people's sin.

While the offerings burned on the altar, temple helpers played cymbals, harps, and stringed instruments. Priests played trumpets, and everyone at the temple worshiped and sang. Then King Hezekiah and the people bowed down to worship God. It was a day of joy and praise!

Hezekiah told the people, "Come near and bring your sacrifices and thank offerings to the Lord's temple." The people brought so many bulls, rams, lambs, sheep, and goats that there were not enough priests to handle all of them. The Levites helped them until the sacrifices were finished.

Hezekiah and all the people rejoiced that God had helped them restore the temple.
