VERSE

Come, let us
worship God.
PSALM 95:6

BUILD a Tent

Invite your child to help you build a tent. Use a large sheet or blanket and drape it over a table or several chairs. Sit in the tent with your child and read aloud the Bible story (reverse side). Mention that Moses told the people to bring gifts so they could build a tabernacle or tent church. Talk about how a tent church is different from the church you attend. Mention that people can worship God in any kind of building.

SEARCH Red, Purple, and Blue

Mention that God told Moses that He wanted the people to bring gifts so they could build a tabernacle, or tent church. Moses told the people to bring red, purple, and blue cloth as well as stones, wood, and jewelry. Walk around your home with your child. Encourage her to find things that are red, purple, or blue. Talk about other items she sees that the people might have given.

TOUCH Items

Carry your baby as you take a walk around the room. Tell the Bible story (reverse side). Stop occasionally to help her to touch items such as a wooden table, a fabric covered chair, and a stone (marble). Say: "God told Moses to build the tabernacle. The people worked together to do what God asked."

All the people brought things—wood, stone, cloth, furs, and spices.

Moses was glad the people worked together to build the tabernacle.

Moses called all the people together and told them what God said.

Moses told the people there would be different jobs for the people to do. The people needed to work together to do what God said to do.

The people went home to gather their offerings and get ready to build.

Some brought jewelry and ornaments. Others brought purple, red, and blue cloth. Others brought oils and spices. The people began to work.

So many people helped that Moses said, “Stop bringing gifts. We have all we need for the tabernacle.”

Moses was glad the people worked together to build the tabernacle.

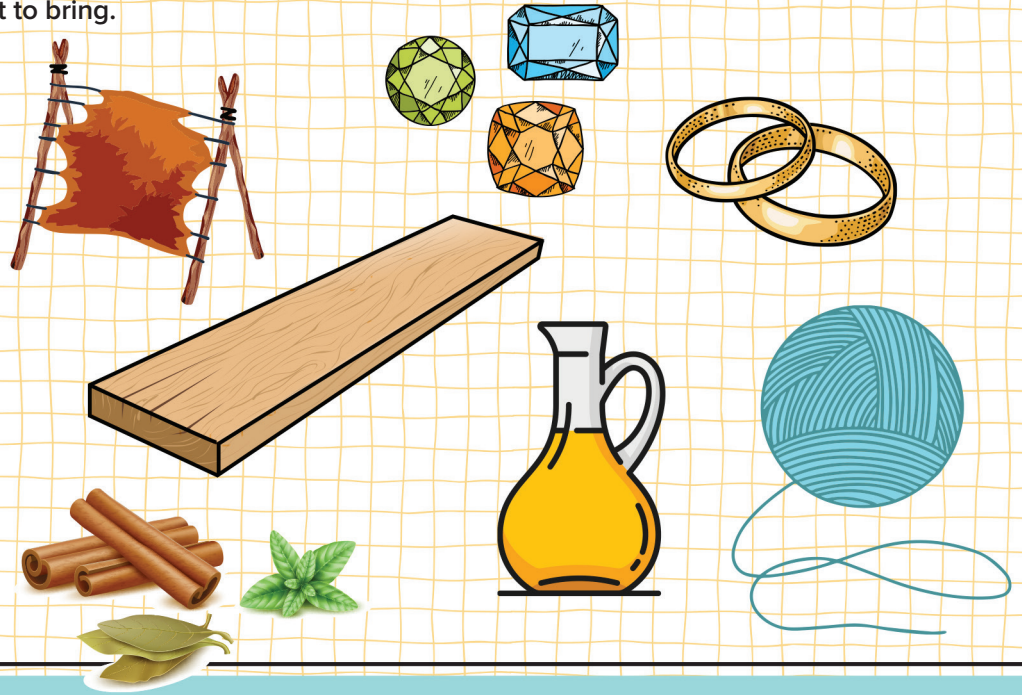


Moses spoke to the people. "We must bring an offering to help build the tabernacle," he said. Moses told the people what to bring.

Building the Tabernacle

EXODUS 35:4–36:37; 39:32-43

Moses spoke to the people. “God said we must bring an offering to help build the tabernacle.” Moses told the people what to bring.

Some people brought all kinds of gold jewelry and gemstones. Some people brought red, blue, and purple yarn; fine linen; and animal skins. Other people brought wood, oil, and spices.

The workers said to Moses, “The people are bringing too much. We have enough to build the tabernacle.” So Moses told the people to stop bringing their offerings.

The workers began to build the tabernacle. First, they made curtains from linen with blue, purple, and red yarn. Then the workers made a tent from animal skins. The tabernacle was built from planks of wood.

According to God's directions, a special helper named Bezalel (BEHZ uh leh) built a special wooden box that was covered in gold. It was called the ark of the covenant. The stone tablets with the Ten Commandments written on them were kept in the ark of the covenant.

Moses looked at everything the workers had made. They had made everything just as God had said.

THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

This Bible story showed your child that worshipping God includes listening and responding to Him. God chose Isaiah to go and tell people His messages. Isaiah responded to God and served as God's prophet.



LIVE IT OUT

Review the Bible story and talk about how Isaiah responded to God. Remind your child that she may not physically hear God's voice, but she can worship God by listening and responding to Him. Together as a family pray the words of the angels from Isaiah 6:3.

Isaiah Responded to God

ISAIAH 6-7

The prophet Isaiah wrote about his astonishing vision of God. In the vision Isaiah saw God seated on a high throne and His robe filled the temple.

Above the throne Isaiah saw angels. Each angel had six wings. Two wings covered his face, two covered his feet, and two he used to fly. The angels called out, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord. His glory fills the whole earth!"

When the angels spoke, the doorways shook, and the temple was filled with smoke.

Isaiah was amazed. He cried, "Woe is me! I am undone, ruined! I am a man of unclean speech, I live among people of unclean speech, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of Hosts!"

One of the angels flew to Isaiah with a glowing coal taken from the altar with tongs. He touched Isaiah's mouth with the coal and said, "Now this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away."

Then Isaiah heard the Lord's voice: "Who should I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah responded, "Here I am. Send me."

God sent Isaiah to King Ahaz with a message. Ahaz and the people had heard about the plans of two enemy kings to attack the kingdom of Judah. Their fear made them shake like trees in the wind. Isaiah told Ahaz to be calm because "God says, 'It will not happen. If you do not stand firm in your faith, you will not stand at all!'"

Then Isaiah said, "God will give you a sign. A virgin will become pregnant. She will have a Son and name Him Immanuel."
