God, You are great,
2 SAMUEL 7:22



BUCKLE a Car Seat

Buckle your child in her car seat for a ride. Talk about how the seat and seatbelt keep her safe on the road. Talk through each step of the process of securing your child in her seat. Remind your child that God protected baby Moses and God protects us. Say a quick prayer, thanking God for protecting your family.

Babies

PLAY with Water

Encourage your baby to play with water toys at bath time. Invite your baby to pour water from containers and splash in the water. Tell him that Moses' mother placed Moses in a basket in the reeds to keep him safe. Remind him that God protected Moses.

*BATHE a Baby Doll

Give your child a waterproof doll or action figure in a plastic bin or at bath time. Encourage your child to wash, dry, and swaddle the toy. Remind your child that God kept baby safe when he was in a basket in the reeds. Mention that God is good and He takes care of us.

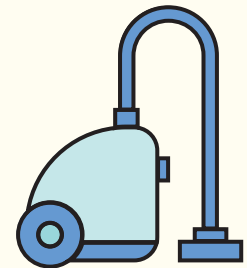
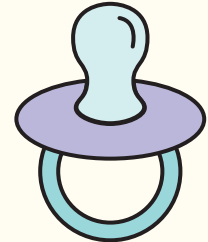
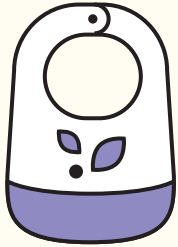

God protected Moses when he was a baby. Circle the items a baby might need.

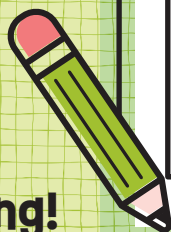

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God Protected Moses

**Based on Exodus 1:22–2:10;
Numbers 26:59**

A woman named Jochebed (JAHK uh bed) had a baby boy. Pharaoh, the king of Egypt, did not want baby boys to live. For three months, Jochebed hid her baby. When she could not hide him any longer, Jochebed decided to do something to keep the baby safe. She took a basket made from tall grass and covered the outside of the basket with black, sticky tar. The tar would keep water out of the basket.

Jochebed placed her baby in the basket. She took the basket and set it in the tall grass near the edge of the Nile River. The baby's sister, Miriam, stayed near the river to watch her baby brother.

Pharaoh's daughter went to take a bath in the river. She saw the basket in the tall grass. She sent one of her helpers to get the basket. She opened the basket and saw the baby boy. He was crying. She felt sorry for him.

Miriam came out of the tall grass. "Do you want me to get someone to take care of the baby?" she asked Pharaoh's daughter. "I can get a woman to feed and care for the baby." "Yes," Pharaoh's daughter said. Miriam hurried to get her mother, Jochebed.

"Take this baby and care for him," Pharaoh's daughter said.

When the child grew older, Jochebed took the baby to Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. She named him Moses.

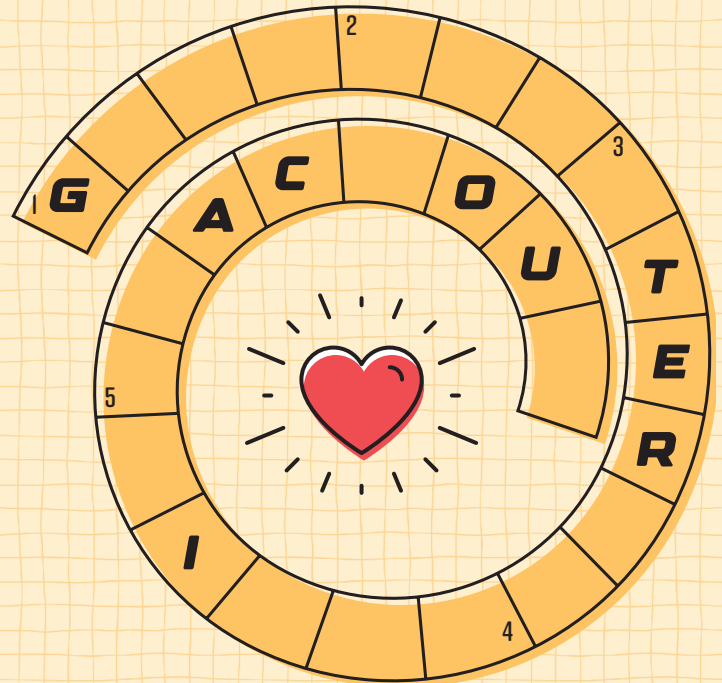

Think about all the things that make God great. Then use the clues to fill in words about God's character in the boxes of the spiral. Note that the last letter of each word is the first letter of the next word.

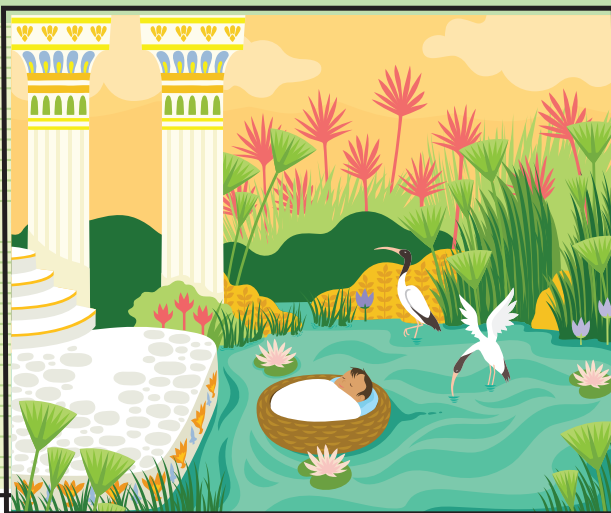

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God Protected Moses

Exodus 1:22–2:10;
Numbers 26:59

Pharaoh, the king of Egypt, was worried there were too many Israelite slaves and that one day they would attack Egypt. The king appointed slave masters who made the slaves work hard and treated them badly. Then Pharaoh gave a horrible command. He ordered every Israelite baby boy to be killed.

Around this time, an Israelite woman had a baby boy. She saw how beautiful and precious her baby was, and she wanted him to live. She hid him for about three months, but soon she could no longer hide him. The woman got a basket and waterproofed it with tar and pitch. She put her baby boy in the basket and set it in the tall grass at the edge of the Nile River. Miriam, the baby's older sister, stood at a distance and watched to see what would happen to her baby brother.

Soon, Pharaoh's daughter, the princess, came to the river to bathe, and she saw the basket. One of the servant girls brought it to her. When Pharaoh's daughter opened the basket, she found a baby inside, and he was crying. The princess felt sad for the baby because she knew that the baby boy was an Israelite.

Miriam stepped forward and said, "Would you like me to find a woman to help you take care of the baby?"

"Yes, go," answered Pharaoh's daughter. Miriam brought her mother, Jochebed, to Pharaoh's daughter. Jochebed cared for her own baby according to the command of the princess.

When the child grew older, Jochebed brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and the boy became her son. The princess named him Moses, "Because," she said, "I drew him out of the water."
