- Icebreaker -If you could have any place in the world completely to yourself for one day, where would you choose?

- The Bible describes Jesus as "the visible image of the invisible God" and "the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being..." (Colossians 1:15; Hebrews 1:3). How does this "big picture" impact your understanding of Jesus as a baby in a manger or as your Savior on the cross?
- 2. Read <u>Colossians 1:15-18</u>. In this passage discussing Jesus, what attributes, actions, or jurisdiction of Christ most stretch your understanding of who He is and how does it deepen your appreciation of His love for you?
- Pastor Tom points to three different Biblical analogies of the church calling her Christ's body (<u>Colossians 1:18</u>), God's family (<u>Romans 8:19-22</u>), and Christ's Kingdom (<u>Colossians 1:13</u>; <u>Philippians 3:20-21</u>). Which of these most deeply resonates with you, and how do you see yourself fitting into that picture?
- **4.** In <u>Colossians 1:23a</u>, <u>2:4, 8</u> Paul warns the church against three "detours" that will lead them away from Jesus: passive drift, teachers of false doctrine, and "high-sounding" human philosophies. How do these "detours" differ, and to which are you most vulnerable? What step can you take to stay on course?
- **5.** Pastor Tom asked, "Is Jesus first in your life today?" and "Have you gotten off course in your relationships with Jesus?" Is your mind and heart focused on Jesus, "who has done it all and who is above all?" If not, what is keeping you from saying your own personal 'YES!' or refocusing on Him?

1. Jesus Is Above All

Paul wants us to have the big picture of who Jesus is...

Jesus is above everything because He is God Almighty (note **Colossians 1:15**; Hebrews 1:3; John 1:18).
