- Icebreaker -

- 1. Read <u>Colossians 1:24</u>, <u>Acts 9:15-16</u>, and <u>Timothy 3:12</u>. Pastor Tom quotes Chambers saying, "No healthy saint ever chooses suffering. He chooses God's will as Jesus did whether it means suffering or not." Share an example of this from your life, along with how it turned out.
- **2.** Pastor Tom listed 3 questionable reasons why people serve; so others notice, for self-satisfaction, or so they can post about it on social media. Share which one you have seen most often. How can understanding **Colossians 1:25** help guide your motives to a Christ-centered approach?
- **3.** Read <u>Colossians 2:1-3</u>. Pastor Tom emphasizes how Paul's imprisonment did not hinder his vision for people because his focus was on up Jesus. What limits *your* vision for people and what steps can you take to focus up on Him, embracing *His* vision for people?
- **4.** Reflect on times when you felt tired or exhausted from serving. How might asking, "What does God want me to do?" shift your focus from seeking energy to being energized by participating in God's will?
- **5.** Read <u>Colossians 2:5-7</u> and <u>Mark 10:45</u>. Pastor Tom shared two important points; Paul's focus was on Jesus, and because of that...on people, specifically, "...to rescue, redeem, and transform people's lives." How is God prompting you to step into alignment with His will by serving Him and His church?

1. How Do I Navigate Suffering?

Paul understood that serving Jesus isn't always simple, <u>easy</u>, and fun... (note <u>Colossians 1:24</u>; <u>Acts 9:15-16</u>).

Following and serving Jesus includes navigating hardships, opposition, and even <u>persecution</u> (note <u>2 Timothy 3:12</u>).

All of us rejoice in sufferings...just other people's sufferings (not in the <u>mean</u> sense...).

No <u>healthy</u> saint ever chooses suffering. He chooses God's <u>will</u> as Jesus did whether it means suffering or not. (Chambers)

2. What's My Motivation for Serving?

- Why do I serve Jesus?
- So others will <u>notice</u>?
- For my own self-satisfaction?
- So I can <u>post</u> about it on social media?

Note Colossians 1:25

When you know Who you're serving and why you're serving, it gives you strength to keep going when your kids don't appreciate you, when people don't say *thank you*, when it was a tough week at work/school.

You and I are <u>called</u> by God to serve Him and others (note <u>Ephesians 2:10</u>). Mystery = something once <u>hidden</u> but now revealed (note <u>Colossians 1:26, 27</u>).

Christ lives in you.

This is in the Old Testament, but people wrongly assumed they would find God in the Promised Land, or in the <u>Law</u>, or in the Temple (note <u>Jeremiah</u> <u>31:31-34</u>).

Jesus in us is the hope of glory (living life as God designed).

3. Do I Have a Vision for People?

Paul's vision was expansive (note Colossians 1:28).

Perfect = mature

Vision tends to <u>shrink</u> when facing unexpected challenges/obstacles.

Paul was in <u>prison</u>, but his vision hadn't shrunk.

When our focus is up on Jesus, He will help our vision for people and what God can do in someone's life to stay fresh, be compelling, and unshrinkable.

4. Where Will I Get the Strength I Need From?

Note Colossians 1:29

5. Is it About <u>People</u>?
