- Icebreaker -

If you could be the editor of a magazine (hardcopy or digital), which one would it be and why?

- 1. Read <u>Colossians 3:1-4</u> in The Message paraphrase. This passage pictures a Christ-follower whose eyes are "focused down", absorbed with his/her old "dead" life as opposed to being "focused up" on Jesus. What does it look like when you become "absorbed with the things right in front of you" and what effects can it have?
- 2. One thing Pastor Tom suggests that will help shift our focus up is to clean out our "closet" of the "tattered and ill-fitting attitudes and behaviors that genuine Jesus followers need to discard." Which of these "garments" have been the most difficult for you to discard?
- **3.** In <u>Colossians 3:5</u>, Paul indicates that sexual sin extends far beyond promiscuity and includes impure sexual practices and attitudes of all kinds. Since our culture aggressively promotes such impurity, what active measures do you or could you take to avoid having the clothing of your soul tattered and soiled by this corruption?
- 4. In <u>Colossians 3:6-9</u> Paul transitions to the worn-out threads of social sins. Consider the list of behaviors and how you have seen them damage relationships with God and others. Which of these things are still taking up room in your closet and what will you do about it?
- **5.** Pastor Tom made it clear that whether sexual or social, these sins have the same result: they destroy relationships. So, if you can be rid of them like old clothes in a closet then why wouldn't you? Submit to Jesus and allow Him to make room for His new wardrobe. (Colossians 3:1. 3)

So, what are the <u>best-dressed</u> Jesus followers wearing? First of all:

## 1. There's an Old Wardrobe to Discard

Note again Colossians 3:1-4

Paul uses the imagery of clothing to help us see that following Jesus means an entire wardrobe overhaul.

Jesus...knows there are old, tattered and <u>ill-fitting</u> attitudes and behaviors that genuine Jesus followers need to discard.

And the power to do this isn't self-<u>will</u> and self-<u>effort</u>...but it's really possible because Jesus has done it all for us.

The <u>old</u> wardrobe Jesus followers are to discard are primarily divided into two sections:

A. Sexual sins (note Colossians 3:5) - sexual immorality = porneia = illicit sexual intercourse (any kind of sexual intercourse outside of God's design for one man/one woman committed/covenant marriage relationship); impurity (not just sexual intercourse outside of God's design of one man/one woman committed/covenant marriage, but other sexual practices not involving a husband-wife relationship); lust/passion = pathos = uncontrolled illegitimate desire (note Matthew 5:21-22, 27-28; Titus 3:3a); evil desires = all forms of perversion; greed = the desire to have more that disregards the rights of others. It's the arrogant and ruthless assumption that all other persons and things exist for one's own benefit (Caird)...it becomes idolatry because greed puts self-

- interest for illicit/immoral desires, things, and even people, in the place of God. We serve an idol to get what we want rather than embrace and follow God's <u>truth</u>.
- B. <u>Social</u> sins (note <u>Colossians 3:6-9</u>) anger (settled attitude...an angry person <u>demeanor</u>); rage (wrath/passionate <u>outburst</u>/short fuse); malicious behavior (the desire to inflict <u>injury</u> with words/gossip); slander (abusive words to <u>tear down</u> the good name/reputation of someone); filthy language (not only obscenities, but also <u>innuendos</u> and suggestive expressions [coarse humor] which cover underlying impurity); lying = includes deliberate untruths, half-truths (that create a false impression/narrative), and <u>exaggeration</u> (distorts reality and paints a false picture).
