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## **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

- Icebreaker -

What's one thing connected with winter that brings you

Note: Sunday's message dealt specifically with marriage, and while we recognize that not all group members are married, scripture always contains principles which apply to all Jesus followers.

- **1.** Read <u>Colossians 3:14-17</u>. Which things from this passage can people see in you already, and which need to be improved upon?
- 2. For the Christ-follower, submission to authority is part of being a God-honoring citizen and employee (see <u>1 Peter 2:13-14a, 18a</u>). In what ways is this easy for you and when is submission challenging for you?
- **3.** Pastor Tom said that a wife submitting to her husband, "doesn't mean inferior personhood, spirituality or [being] less important. It's a functional submission." Why is this important for both men and women to understand correctly? (Galatians 3:28, Colossians 3:18, 1 Peter 3:1-2, 7)
- **4.** Read <u>1 Peter 3:3-6</u>, <u>Proverbs 18:22</u>; <u>12:4a</u>. Pastor Tom emphasized that, "A wife's character and personality shaped by God's truth and power makes her indescribably beautiful to her husband." Husbands, what quality of inner beauty do you find most attractive in your wife? Wives, in a culture that stresses the importance of how we look, how have you struggled to focus on your inner beauty?
- **5.** Ephesians 5:33b (AMP) instructs wives to respect and treasure their husbands. Husbands/Men what makes you feel respected? Wives/ Women, what are some ways that wives can communicate respect for their husbands and show that they truly treasure them?

### Note Colossians 3:14-17

When Jesus is first place in our lives and everything we *do or say* is for His praise alone, it will have a positive impact on every relationship and personal encounter we have.

## Note Colossians 3:18 and Matthew 8:14-15

So as God designed marriage (and Jesus <u>affirmed</u>, note <u>Matthew 19:3-6</u>), what does God want wives to focus on?

## Understand What <u>Submission</u> Really is and Why it Matters So Much (note <u>1 Peter 3:1a</u>)

In the same way that Jesus followers are to submit to governmental authorities (except when commanded to <u>sin</u>, note <u>1 Peter 2:13-14a</u>) and to their bosses/masters (except when commanded to sin, note <u>1 Peter 2:18a</u>), this is also the <u>attitude</u> Jesus wants wives to have towards their husbands in the marriage relationship.

God created the marriage relationship (just like everything else He created) with divinely given <u>authority</u> in that relationship.

Submission doesn't equal <u>inferiority</u> (Jesus <u>submitted</u> to <u>His parents</u>, note <u>Luke 2:51</u>; and to His Heavenly Father, note <u>John 7:16</u>; yet He was <u>greater</u> than His parents and equal to His Father).

Submission doesn't mean inferior personhood, <u>spirituality</u>, or less important (note <u>1 Peter 3:7</u>; <u>Galatians 3:28</u>).

It's a <u>functional</u> submission.

Note 1 Peter 3:1-2

This text isn't implying that most of these wives had unbelieving husbands, but just the opposite is meant in the original language (if any...even if...unexpected of uncommon situation...note 2 Corinthians 6:14;

#### 1 Corinthians 7:39).

Remember: we may be the only <u>Bible</u> people in our lives may ever read, and the only <u>Jesus</u> they may ever see.

#### Note 1 Peter 3:3-4

A wife's character and personality shaped by God's truth and power makes her <u>indescribably</u> beautiful to her husband (note <u>1 Peter 3:5</u>).

#### Note 1 Peter 3:6

It's faith lived out that produces the beauty God values.

## 2. <u>Treasure</u> Your Husbands (note <u>Ephesians 5:33b</u>)

- A. Recognize your husband can't meet every <u>need</u> you have spiritual leadership doesn't equal <u>perfection</u>. If you expect your husband to always make you happy, content, and your life smooth, you will <u>frustrate</u> and discourage him because he cannot ever meet all those expectations. Only <u>Jesus</u> can meet all our needs.
- B. Give him honest <u>admiration</u> honestly ask yourselves how much you express admiration and appreciation to your husband (and <u>about him to others</u>) in contrast to how much complaints and criticism dominate your words to and about your husband.

#### Am I focused OUT?

- God intends your relationship with your husband to be something good and that gives joy to him and you.
- Note <u>Proverbs 18:22</u>; <u>12:4a</u>
- Marriage isn't a <u>50-50</u> compromise, but a <u>100</u>%-<u>100</u>% commitment and sacrifice.

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
