- Icebreaker -

Who was your best friend when you were growing up and what made them so special to you?

- **1.** Pastor Tom said that, "Slavery has impacted every generation, every ethnicity, every culture, every nation, and every people group from the beginning of human history until today." Does this statement surprise you in its scope why or why not?
- 2. Read <u>Colossians 3:22-4:1</u> and <u>1 Corinthians 7:21-23</u>. Pastor Tom points out, Paul wrote more about the relationship of slaves to masters than he did about family relationships, yet he "clearly was subtly and deftly undercutting slavery in all his writings..." Still, why not just call for an end to slavery? Instead, he called for Jesusfollowing slaves to be excellent slaves: why?
- 3. Read Genesis 2:15; 3:17-19, John 5:17, Ephesians 4:28 and 1Thessalonians 4:11-12. Have you viewed work as a "necessary evil," or as a "Christian virtue?" How has your view affected your attitude toward work?
- **4.** Pastor Tom pointed out that "1/3 of our life (90,000 hours) will be at work..." How does being a Jesus follower impact your workplace interactions and relationships with colleagues, managers/bosses, and clients/customers? (See **Colossians 3:22-24**; **4:1**; **3:17**.)
- 5. "It matters that we have a good work ethic...seek to do our best, because our ultimate performance review comes from Jesus..."

1. Slavery in the Roman Empire

Slavery has impacted every generation, every <u>ethnicity</u>, every culture, every nation, and every people group from the beginning of human history until today.

Chances are very high that somewhere in your <u>genealogy</u> was someone who was once enslaved.

About 25% of Rome's population were slaves.

While not regarded as sub-human, they were seen as <u>property</u> and had no personal rights.

Paul never condones slavery nor <u>revolt</u> against slave owners. But he clearly was subtly and <u>deftly</u> undercutting slavery in all his writings (note <u>1 Corinthians 7:21-23</u>...).

2. God's Plan for Work

Many of us have the mistaken idea that work itself is a necessary evil and result of the <u>curse</u> of human sin.

Before sin entered the world, God gave human beings work to do (note

Genesis 2:15).

God Himself is always working (note John 5:17).

The reason why work is often hard, <u>exhausting</u>, and not always fun/fulfilling is the result of the curse of human sin (note <u>Genesis 3:17-19</u>). Working is consistently portrayed as a Christian <u>virtue</u> (note <u>Ephesians</u> 4:28 and <u>1 Thessalonians</u> 4:11-12).

3. So What's the <u>Relevance</u> of Colossians 3:22-4:1 for Us Today?

It matters that we have a good work <u>ethic</u> and that we always seek to do our best, because our ultimate performance review comes from Jesus and our greatest <u>bonus</u> comes from Him (note <u>Colossians 3:24</u>).
- B. Jesus followers are <u>different</u> on the outside, but we are the <u>same</u> inside (note <u>Colossians 3:11</u>; <u>Galatians 3:26-29</u>).
