- **Romans 2:15** says that even those without God have God's law "written on their hearts". What do you think that means and how have you seen it at work in the lives of unbelieving friends and/or relatives?
- **2.** Pastor Tom says that our conscience can be a gift to help us in times of decision making. Tell of a time when your conscience challenged and changed your mind when faced with a decision.
- 3. Read <u>1 Timothy 4:2</u>. Pastor Tom said that it is possible to "sear" our conscience by ignoring or even violating it over time, rendering it ineffective as a signal or warning from God that something is wrong. What would your decision-making be like with a compromised conscience? Where might it lead you?
- 4. Pastor Tom declared that "only God can give us a good conscience", and He does this when we say 'YES!' to Jesus (Hebrews 9:14). If you are a Christ-follower, what kind of change did you experience in your conscience after you said 'YES!' to Jesus; is it still changing?
- **5.** Pastor Tom indicated that we need to maintain the good conscience given to us by Christ, first, by keeping "short accounts" with God (see 1John 1:9). How does practicing what the passage teaches help you keep a clear conscience?
- **6.** In what ways are you implementing Pastor Tom's second step to maintain a good conscience by being a self-feeding follower of Jesus, filled with the Holy Spirit? (Galatians 3:2-3; Ephesians 5:18b)

Last Sunday we asked the questions,

1. Will this choice/action be helpful?

And we saw 2 tests the Apostle Paul offers to us to guide our decisions:

- A. Will This Decision/Action Make Me a Better Person?
- B. Does This Decision/Action Control Me, or Do I Control It?

The 2nd important question to ask ourselves is:

2. Does This Decision/Action Bother My Conscience? (Note 1 Peter 2:16)

Conscience is the capability and power of mind to <u>distinguish</u> between right and wrong (note <u>Romans 2:12-16</u>).

Conscience is God's indestructible gift that acts as an independent witness within us.

Conscience acts at times as both a prosecuting attorney and a <u>judge</u>. Conscience is our <u>ethical</u> sense organ. (Mathew).

Scriptures tell us that all human beings know there's a God from 2 sources:

- God's <u>creation</u> (<u>Psalm 19:1-6</u>; <u>Romans 1:20</u>).
- Human being's conscience (Romans 2:15).

Conscience = $\underline{knowing}$ together with. God uses our consciences in $\underline{3}$ main ways in our lives:

- A. It puts in <u>CAPS</u> what we should do even when we're seemingly all alone, conscience shouts within us, <u>YES</u> and <u>NO</u>.
- B. It acts as a <u>judge</u> although our human conscience isn't perfect...it still helps us understand how close or how far off is the <u>alignment</u> of our conduct with God's truth and standards.
- C. It acts as an <u>enforcer</u> whenever you or I <u>violate</u> the dictates of our conscience, there's an almost automatic response...(note <u>Genesis 3:7-8</u>; <u>42:21</u>; <u>Psalm 32:3-5</u>). Drugs, therapy, or just trying to <u>ignore</u> our conscience doesn't work. Only <u>God</u> can give us a good conscience.

Problem is, our conscience can be rendered <u>impotent</u> (seared, note 1Timothy 4:2).

If we continuously ignore/reject the promptings of our conscience, it will wane in its ability to signal/warn us that something is wrong.

- D. What is a <u>clear</u> conscience (note <u>Acts 24:16</u>; <u>Hebrews 13:18</u>)? we receive a clear conscience when we say 'YES!' to Jesus as Lord (note <u>Hebrews 9:14, 22</u>). It's the blood of Jesus that can cleanse our <u>stain-filled</u> consciences from sin, shame, and guilt (note <u>Romans 5:1</u>; <u>8:1</u>).
- E. <u>Maintaining</u> a good conscience (note <u>1 Timothy 1:5</u>) first, make sure to keep short <u>accounts</u> with God (note <u>1 John 1:9</u>). Next, give the Holy Spirit something to work with (be a <u>self-feeding</u> follower of Jesus)...And also be <u>filled</u> with the Holy Spirit (note <u>Galatians 3:3</u>).

- <u>Communion</u> is a great time to let God do some work on our consciences.
