- Icebreaker -

What was the proudest moment of your childhood?

- 1. On the night of Jesus' trial, two of His disciples are specifically identified as betraying Him: Judas and Peter. Read Luke 22:32-34. Pastor Tom said, "...Peter's failure (and our failures) don't have to be that which defines us." Why do you think Judas' failure ultimately did define him while Peter's did not?
- 2. Pastor Tom reminded us that "...our failures are not greater than God's mercy." How have you experienced that truth in your own life and why can it be so hard to believe?
- Pastor Tom asked, "Do you feel forgiven?" If not, what is keeping you from believing the words of Romans 3:23-24, Colossians 1:14, and 1 John 1:9?
- **4.** Read **Micah 7:18-19**. Pastor Tom pointed out that God does not forgive "grudgingly", but rather "desires" to forgive us. How should this truth change the way you approach God when you have failed or fallen into sin (which we all do **1 John 1:8-10**)?
- Pastor Tom also asked the question: "Am I welcoming God's mercy into my life?" What prevents you from receiving the mercy of God: pride, fear, embarrassment, unbelief, or something else? Name it and talk/pray together about overcoming obstacles you may be placing in the way of His mercy.

God's mercy shows us that:

1. Jesus Doesn't <u>Give Up</u> on Us

Note Luke 22:33-34

...Peter's failure (and our failures) don't have to be that which <u>defines</u> us. Everyone fails at times (note **Proverbs 24:16a**).

In fact, the Scriptures tell us if we don't think we fail/sin, we're <u>self</u>-deceived (note **1 John 1:8-10**).

But our failures are not greater than God's mercy.

Even when you fail, God knows your <u>name</u> and wants you to be included in what He is doing in your community and around the world.

2. God <u>Forgives</u> Me

No amount of money, no material thing, no other relationship, no vacation, cruise, adventure, position, experience, etc., even <u>remotely</u> compares to being forgiven by God.

Question = Do you *feel* forgiven?

- A. God <u>desires</u> to forgive me it's not something He does <u>grudgingly</u> (note **Nehemiah 9:17**; **Micah 7:18b**). God looks forward to forgiving us and has from before the foundation of the world!
- B. God <u>unreservedly</u> forgives me (note **Romans 3:23-24**; **Colossians** 1:14). Most people who struggle with this truth struggle for one of two reasons:
 - i. We don't believe it.
 - ii. We don't deserve it.
- C. God <u>instantaneously</u> forgives us He convicts us of our sin and allows us to feel guilty because He <u>loves</u> us (note **1 John 1:9**). Note **Isaiah 55:7b**
- D. God totally <u>forgives</u> me (note **Colossians 2:13-14**; **Micah 7:19**; **James 2:13b**).

Am I welcoming God's mercy into my life?
