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# **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

- Icebreaker -

What is one item you own that you really should throw away, but probably never will?

- 1. Read Matthew 6:21. Pastor Tom reiterated that our hearts always follow what we treasure most. Compare and contrast Zacchaeus' response to Jesus' call (Luke 19:1-10) with that of the rich young ruler (Mark 10:17-22). Where was each man's heart in the end and how does that compare with where your heart is?
- 2. Read Luke 21:1-4. In the story, Jesus describes an entirely new value system when He says that, "this poor widow has given more than all the rest of them." If the amount you give is not how God grades generosity, then what needs to change for you to live out this new Jesus-value in your life?
- **3.** Read Acts 4:32-5:11. The story of Ananias and Sapphira is still just as shocking to our ears today as it was when it happened. Why do you think God was so offended by faux generosity? How can you ensure that your own generosity is authentic both in your heart and in public?
- **4.** Read **2 Corinthians 9:7**. What does being a cheerful giver look like in your life and family?
- **5.** How does your generosity impact getting to heaven? (John 6:29; Ephesians 2:8-9) Trick question, it doesn't! So, what do these passages say is the way to God and then how does the tension between Jesus as your Treasure, and money as your treasure play out in your life?

## Note 1 Timothy 6:10

So this series is about us taking stock of how we handle money and how God's truth can help us experience greater <u>financial</u> health.

The reality is none of us are born generous.

# **?.** Because What Jesus Said in Matthew <u>6:21</u> Is Really True

### Note Matthew 6:21

...whatever our treasure is determines the direction/pathway of our life.

- A. Zacchaeus (note Luke 19:1-8) what's the <u>first</u> evidence of Zacchaeus' changed heart? <u>Financial</u> (note Luke 19:9-10). Money is the <u>spotlight</u> on a person's spiritual condition. It's an <u>index</u> to our character. It's a reflection of our heart.
- B. The Poor Widow (note Luke 21:1-2) giving is always a personal choice/action, but it's never private. Whether we're comfortable with it or not, Jesus watches what we do with His money (God owns it all), including giving. Jesus uses heavenly accounting formulas to determine the actual value of a gift (note Luke 21:3-4).

- C. Ananias and Sapphira (note Acts 4:32-37; 5:1-2) people can be fooled and are all the time. But no one can ever con God (note Acts 5:3-11). Hypocrisy and lying, but how was it manifested? Finances. Generosity must alway come from the heart and be completely voluntary (note Acts 5:4; 2 Corinthians 9:7). Ultimately it was their love of money that brought about God's immediate justice. We get so used to God's grace that we call God's justice injustice.
- D. The <u>Rich</u> Young Ruler (note <u>Mark 10:17-20</u>) Jesus isn't telling this person that giving away your money gets you to <u>heaven</u> (note <u>John 6:29</u>; <u>Ephesians 2:8-9</u>). He's helping him see he is a <u>sinner</u> and needs forgiveness (note <u>Exodus 20:17</u>). Jesus knew where his treasure was and was <u>inviting</u> him to make Jesus his treasure. But...(note <u>Mark 10:22</u>).
