- 4. Read Acts 1:8, 2:1, 5-8 and Acts 2:41. How do these passages demonstrate not only the value and priority of gathering together, but gathering with an attitude of anticipation as well? (What were you anticipating God doing in your life during last Sunday's service?) What about next Sunday?
- 5. Read 1 Corinthians 12:4-6, 12-14, 27. Here the Apostle Paul uses a picture to describe the "together" nature of the mission. How does Paul's picture motivate you to bring your gifts to be used on mission together?
