- Icebreaker -

- **1.** Which of the "one anothers" in this series have you begun living out in your daily life? (Accept, honor, love, serve or be on mission with one another...)
- 2. "God knows we need to be comforted." (Isaiah 40:1) God gave Jesus followers His Holy Spirit to be the "Counselor/Comforter" (John 14:16-17). How do these passages help you understand that "comforting one another is a personal activity"?
- **3.** Read **2 Corinthians 1:3-9**, **11:23b-29**. When have you experienced God's comfort and how has it helped you in encouraging others in need of His comfort?
- **4.** Read **1 Thessalonians 4:13-18**. "Truth-filled words shared lovingly and sensitively and with right motives can bring real comfort." When have you experienced comfort from another person and how did it impact you?
- **5.** Are you in need of God's comfort, or is there someone you know who needs comfort? What steps will you take this week to rest in God's comfort and/or share His comfort with others?

Loneliness isn't a 21st century issue...

The good news is that God sees us and knows all about us, and He knows how to <u>address</u> the problem of loneliness.

Note 2 Corinthians 1:3-4

God knows we need to be comforted (note Isaiah 40:1).

In the New Testament, the <u>Holy Spirit</u> is described as "the Counselor/Comforter" (John 14:16).

Jesus <u>regularly</u> showed compassion (note Mark 1:41; Matthew 14:14; Matthew 20:34; John 14:18).

What Does It Mean to Comfort One Another?

Comfort = to soothe in grief...relief in affliction, encourage...to call <u>near</u>. The Holy Spirit = the Counselor/Comforter/Advocate/one who stands <u>alongside</u> of (note **John 14:16-17**).

Comforting one another is a <u>personal</u> activity...

2. Comforting One Another Matters (note John 16:33)

Jesus followers aren't <u>inoculated</u> from trials...suffering...problems... But following Jesus means we never go through tough times <u>alone</u> or in our own strength.

We all need, at times, to be soothed when grieving, relieved when burdened, <u>consoled</u> when sad, and cheered and encouraged.

3. How Can We Comfort Each Other?

- A. By <u>personally</u> experiencing God's comfort we're most helpful when we <u>lean</u> into the source of all true comfort (note 2 Corinthians 1:3). But when I've personally experienced God's comfort, I know where to <u>point</u> others to (note 2 Corinthians 1:4). Note 2 Corinthians 11:23b-29; 1:5-9.
- B. <u>Trusting</u> that God is in control real comfort is always found in an <u>atmosphere</u> of truth (note **1 Thessalonians 4:13-18**). Truth-filled words shared lovingly and sensitively and with right <u>motives</u> can bring real comfort. Paul's <u>big</u> truth theme in these verses? God is in <u>control!</u> He has the last word and the final say, and He will care for His people whether alive on this earth or <u>asleep</u> in Jesus. The present, future, and our <u>lives</u> are in God's hands. This is comforting, <u>isn't it</u>?
