- **1.** Read **2 Timothy 1:15, 16**; **4:9-10a**, **16**. Paul understood the difficulty of being alone as well as how refreshing someone like Onesiphorus (on-uh-SIFF-uh-ruhs) could be. Describe a time you were refreshed by someone and the impact it had on you.
- Pastor Tom indicated that "encouragers take risks." (2 Timothy 1:8, 16) What risks might you encounter as you reach out to those who need encouragement and what has kept you from taking those risks?
- **3.** Read **2 Timothy 1:17**. Have you ever found encouraging someone to be hard work? Explain your answer.
- 4. Pastor Tom explained that "spiritual consistency" like Onesiphorus displayed is a "product of a Spirit-filled/led/controlled life." What steps are you taking (or need to take) to be a consistent encourager to others?
- **5.** Thinking back through this series, which of the "one anothers" (accept, honor, love, serve, be on mission with, comfort, instruct, bear with, take steps with, or encourage) have you found most impactful as you've applied what God is teaching you?



Large <u>doses</u> of encouragement are important for Jesus followers as we navigate a world where encouragement is often hard to find.

<u>Everyone</u> needs encouragement.

Onesiphorus = bringing advantage.

#### L Encouragers Refresh Others

Note 2 Timothy 1:15, 16; 4:9-10a, 16

Often <u>refreshed</u>...often visited and encouraged me...

People who are refreshing aren't constantly negative, fault-finding, whiny, and complaining.

Often refreshed me = word picture = <u>braced</u> me up.

Paul was a <u>weary</u> runner approaching the finishing line (note **2 Timothy 4:7**).

This wasn't a one-off deal (often refreshed...).

### **2.** Encouragers Take <u>Risks</u> (note 2 Timothy 1:16)

Onesiphorus wasn't a fair-weather friend...

Note 2 Timothy 1:8

Onesiphorus was willing to risk his reputation, safety, and perhaps even his <u>life</u>...in order to encourage Paul.

### 3. Encouragers Work Hard

(note 2 Timothy 1:17 = ...searched everywhere...)

Onesiphorus had to search through an unfamiliar city for a condemned prisoner in a <u>hostile</u>/difficult atmosphere.

A good man will seek the opportunity of doing good and will not shun that offer.

#### 4. Encouragers Are Consistent (note 2 Timothy 1:18)

Onesiphorus consistently encouraged others, whether in his hometown/home church, or in the unfriendly confines of a <u>cold</u> dungeon in Rome. This spiritual consistency was a <u>product</u> of a Spirit-filled/led/controlled life.

#### **SO MY NEXT STEP IN PEOPLE-ING 101:**

- What's our <u>reputation</u> when it comes to encouraging others?
- Do we bring an advantage to others?
- Do we <u>refresh</u> others?
- Jesus wants us to stand out in a cancel culture/social media trolling culture by consistently encouraging others.
- Note 1 Thessalonians 5:11
- Real <u>success</u> and purpose in the Christian life is often as straightforward as taking God's Word to heart personally to encourage one another.
