DISCUSSION GUIDE

- Icebreaker -

If all your posts or uploads on social media were guaranteed to get at least a million views, how would that change your life?

- **1.** Pastor Tony shared how our spiritual posture either reflects culture, our consciousness, "Christianity," or Christ. How would you know which of these you're reflecting? (1 Timothy 2:8, Psalm 95:6)
- **2.** Consider the four inward postures Pastor Tony addressed, reading aloud as a group the scriptures used to describe each one. Which of these four postures is the easiest and hardest for you?
- **3.** Read Colossians 3:13-14. Pastor Tony shared how a grace-filled outward posture encourages us to not just tolerate others but to move toward them in love. How is God calling you to more intentionally move toward others in love?
- **4.** Colossians 3:15-17 challenges us to let Christ rule in our hearts and actions. Which upward posture from the message do you need to consider to better allow Christ to rule in your life?
- **5.** Pastor Tony encouraged us to follow God's call into new postures to both grow and lead others to Jesus. What posture is God lovingly challenging you to grow into today?

We tend to focus on our <u>experiences</u>... God invites you to consider your posture.

We often feel stuck in the "space in between" - moments when we're not where we were, but not yet where we want to be.

- These moments can feel confusing, frustrating, and discouraging... or can become wonder-filled.
- What can we do with the waiting, the uncertainty, the tension?
 And where's God in all of it?

The Bible shows us that our physical posture can both reflect and <u>influence</u> our spiritual journey. (1 Timothy 2:8, Psalm 95:6)

• Our spiritual posture will either reflect <u>culture</u>, reflect <u>consciousness</u>, reflect <u>"Christianity</u>," or reflect <u>Christ</u>.

Inward Posture (Colossians 3:12)

- The <u>Story</u> you think you're in changes your perspective and sense of <u>identity</u>.
- Static pathways: How our perspective gets rooted...
 - Posture of <u>Closure</u>: Opens you up to <u>self-righteousness</u> (see **Jonah 4:5**)
 - Posture of <u>Sitting</u>: Opens you up to <u>honesty</u> (see <u>Job 2:8</u>)
 - Posture of Submission: Opens you up to receive (see Luke 10:39)
 - Posture of <u>Collapsing</u>: Opens you up to <u>surrender</u> (see 1 Kings 19:5-6)





Outward Posture (Colossians 3:13-14)

- Full-on, grace-filled relationships compel you to do more than tolerate.
- Dynamic pathways: How our love gets moving...
 - Posture of <u>Hiding</u>: Opens you up to <u>gaps</u> (see <u>Genesis 3:8</u>)
 - Posture of <u>Kneeling</u>: Opens you up to <u>forgiveness</u> (see <u>Acts 7:59-60</u>)
 - Posture of Presence: Opens you up to compassion (see Job 2:13)
 - Posture of <u>Hugging</u>: Opens you up to <u>(re)connecting</u> (see **Genesis 33:4**)

Upward Posture (Colossians 3:15-17)

- Expressive pathways: How our faith gets renovated.
 - Posture of <u>Standing</u>: Opens you up to <u>declare</u> (see <u>Daniel 3:11-12</u>)
 - Posture of Extension: Opens you up to awe (see Psalm 63:4)
 - Posture of <u>Dancing</u>: Opens you up to <u>celebration</u> (see **2 Samuel 6:14-15, 21-22**)
 - Posture of <u>Prostration</u>: Opens you up to <u>humility</u> (see <u>Matthew 26:39</u>, <u>Revelation 7:11</u>)

WHAT CAN I DO IN THE SPACE IN BETWEEN?:

• Let your posture today <u>reset yesterday</u>, <u>build tomorrow</u>, and <u>discover eternity</u>.
