
What's something you enjoyed doing when you were younger that you still enjoy today?

- **1.** As a group, explore what you have been discovering from reading Chapters 3 and 4 of *The Benefit of Doubt*.
- Read Judges 6 aloud in the group, paying special attention to: 1) What God said about Gideon; 2) What Gideon said about himself; and 3) How Gideon responded to what God said about him. How do Gideon's insecurities and doubts compare with your own?
- Gideon's personal history affected how he responded to God and saw himself. What from your past impacts how you see yourself and keeps you from believing what God says about you? (See Judges 6:15)
- **4.** Gideon had trouble trusting God because he doubted himself. When has your own self-doubt kept you from embracing God's presence or plan for your life? (Judges 6:14-15, 27; 7:10-11)
- **5.** Like Gideon, God declares a new identity for Christ followers in the following passages (Romans 8:16-17, 37-39; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 1:5; 1 Peter 2:9). How do these truths about you change the way you view and live your life?
- 6. To impress this true identity in your mind, focus on Romans 8:16-17, 37-39; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 1:5; and 1 Peter 2:9 this week, whether by memorizing, reading, meditating, note cards on your mirror etc. (Try "Wrinkly Bible Memory," a Bible memorization app.)

The Benefit of Doubt
"Fleeced?"

...we're <u>focusing</u> on different people in the Scriptures who struggled with doubt. But God actually used their doubts to ultimately <u>deepen</u> their faith and not have doubt be what defines them.

Today we're going to focus on someone who is known for his <u>multiple</u> times of doubt, and yet, he's also listed in the *Faith Hall of Fame*.

Gideon's life demonstrates that more often than we may realize, our doubts about God, at their <u>roots</u>, have more to do with our own personal insecurities, dysfunctions, struggles, and weaknesses than anything about God Himself.

Gideon's doubts were based in:

1. His Personal History

Our personal history...greatly <u>influences</u> how we see ourselves (note **Judges 6:15**).

Gideon, painfully aware of his heritage, was <u>dominated</u> by his past even when talking to God (just like some of us...)

...we've resigned ourselves to the *losers* column of life and it becomes an <u>incubator</u> of doubt...

2. His Limited Abilities

Gideon didn't give out obvious leadership <u>capabilities</u> (note **Judges 6:11b**; **6:1-6**, **12**).

Note Judges 6:14-15, 22-23, 27, 36-40; 7:10-11; 8:20

When dominated by our past and perceived limitations, the question, "How can I...?", becomes a <u>statement</u>...

3. His Reputation

Note Judges 6:25-30

Gideon's doubts were <u>fueled</u> by how others saw him.

The fact is, we can be <u>imprisoned</u> and consumed by doubts about our reputation (real or perceived).

So can there be benefit to my doubt?

- Gideon's struggles with fear, doubt, and insecurity are the same struggles many of us have in 2025.
- At the root of this struggle is when we try to find our security, identity, and worth in things that can be <u>taken away</u>...
- ...we're setting ourselves up for failure, <u>bondage</u>, disappointment, and doubts.
- God gave Gideon a <u>new</u> identity and perspective (note Judges 6:12)...
- ...and He does the same for us in Jesus (<u>saints</u>, children of God, royal priesthood, holy nation, heirs of God, co-heirs with Jesus...).
- Gideon discovered his identity, security, and worth was not in himself, or in what he didn't have, or what could be taken away from him, but that his worth and identity was in the <u>Eternal</u> and Almighty God who told him who he really was...
- When you know who you really are in Jesus, doubts <u>diminish</u> because we're no longer putting our trust in things that can be taken away or that are temporary.
- In Jesus, we are <u>new</u> creations.
- We are more than conquerors.
- We are members of God's <u>forever</u> family.
- Doubts no longer have to <u>define</u> us.
