- Icebreaker -

- **1.** What stood out to you from Chapters 7 and 8?
- **2.** Describe a time you have felt as though God hit the pause button in your life.
- **3.** Do you believe God's timing is perfect and unstoppable, why or why not? (See **Habakkuk 2:3**)
- **4.** What steps can you take to remain obedient while in God's waiting room?
- 5. Pastor Tom said, "To trust Him my relationship with God isn't based on what I see, or want, or the result of what I want. Our faith is to be based on the character and goodness and nature of God..." What pauses in your life do you need to surrender; choosing to trust in God instead of in yourself? (See Habakkuk 2:4; Romans 1:17)
- **6.** Spend some time as a group in prayer, surrendering to God your pauses from the previous question and encouraging one another of God's goodness.

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We've been <u>focusing</u> on different people in the Scriptures who struggled with doubt.

But God actually <u>used</u> their doubts to ultimately deepen their faith and not have doubt be what defines them.

Habakkuk = to <u>wrestle</u>; to embrace

His message, questions, and doubts reflect the <u>tension</u> of wanting to embrace God, but because what he's seeing doesn't match up with what he believes, he wrestles with God (note **Habakkuk 1:2-3**).

We often doubt that God is good when life isn't; and this is <u>exaggerated</u> even more so when it feels like God is making us wait/hit the pause button.

Note Habakkuk 2:3

1. Why Does God Push Pause at Times in My Life?

Waiting can be such a turbulent time in our life because we don't always know what the timeline will be.

When God pushes *pause* in our lives, it's always to accomplish His <u>purposes</u>.

2. God's Timelines Always Included Pauses

- Paul experienced times of waiting (note Galatians 1-2; Acts 16).
- <u>John</u> sent into exile on the remote island of Patmos...but... (note **Revelation 1:9**).
- Even Jesus had to wait (note John 2:4; 7:30).

But God's pauses are never <u>permanent</u> (note **Habakkuk 2:3** = appointed time = moaid (Hebrew) = perfect, <u>unstoppable</u> timing of God). Waiting doesn't mean doing nothing. Waiting means not going <u>outside</u> of God as we do somethina. (Evans)

3. When I'm in God's Waiting Room...

- A. Know God always has the last word and will <u>accomplish</u> His plans (note **Habakkuk 2:4a**) - and because God is always good and right in all He does, even when we don't understand His plans, we have the <u>choice</u>...
- B. To <u>trust</u> Him (note **Habakkuk 2:4b** with **Romans 1:17**; **Galatians 3:11**; **Hebrews 10:38**) my <u>relationship</u> with God isn't based on what I see, or want, or the result I want. Our faith is to be based on the character and goodness and <u>nature</u> of God...

So can there be benefit to my doubt?

- I will wait.
- I won't <u>drift</u> away or walk away from God.
- Even though my situation is hard and I'm not sure what God may do, I will stay <u>engaged</u> with God as I wait.
- But the Lord...
- God is still in charge (note Habakkuk 2:20).
- I will follow Him and worship Him before I see Him move.
- Because God is <u>God</u> and in charge, I can choose to trust and follow Him.

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
