
If you could instantly organize one thing you own or manage, what would you pick and why?

- **1.** As a group, discuss your thoughts and takeaways from Chapters 9 and 10 of *The Benefit of Doubt*.
- **2.** John's upbringing gave him a clear sense of God's call and story (Luke 1:5-6, 8-11, 13-17, 36-41). How has your upbringing helped shape your understanding of God?
- Pastor Tom shared that experiencing the love and power of God is "no inoculation against doubt." Read Matthew 3:15b-17 and Luke 7:18-19. John went from strong belief to stunning doubt. What do you do when you find yourself on this rollercoaster of emotions?
- 4. Read Matthew 14:3-5; Luke 3:19-20, 7:18b-19. Where did John go when his experiences shook his faith in Jesus? What does it look like to bring *your* doubts to Jesus?
- 5. Read Luke 7:21-28. Jesus responded patiently to John the Baptist's doubt, reassuring him and speaking well of him to others, even praising his faith! What good things does Jesus see in you when he sees past your doubts?
- **6.** Pastor Tom stated: "In John the Baptist's deepest pain, Jesus sent a promise to strengthen his faith and He will do the same for you and me." Will you choose to believe His promise?

But God actually used their doubts to ultimately <u>deepen</u> their faith and not have doubt be what defines them.

John the Baptist shows us no one is immune from navigating doubts about Jesus:

## 1. Despite Our <u>Family</u> Background/History

Note Luke 1:5-6; 8-11, 13-17, 36-41

John grew up knowing that his life was ordained by God for an incredible mission...(note **Luke 1:18-22**).

Being born and raised in a solid Christian home with godly parents, with a good church to be a part of, with spiritually healthy friends, etc., is no <u>inoculation</u> against doubts creeping into our lives (note **Matthew 14:1-5**; **Luke 7:18-19**).

## 2. Despite Experiencing God's Power and Greatness

Note Matthew 11:12-13; Luke 3:2b-7a; Matthew 3:13-14; John 1:29 And what did John the Baptist <u>see</u> and <u>hear</u> when he baptized Jesus (note Matthew 3:13-17)?

We can <u>experience</u> God's presence and love and faithfulness and power in worship, in our personal times with God in prayer and Scripture reading, in answers to prayer, seeing God use us in lives of others, see our own life and the lives of others transformed by the grace of God, and still deal with doubts (note <u>Luke 7:18b-19</u>).

## 3. We Will All Face Circumstances that Cause Us to Question God

Note Matthew 14:1-5: Luke 3:19-20

Are You the One? - was a question that had never crossed his mind before.

But his desperate circumstances seemed to <u>deflate</u> what he presumed was true and would never doubt.

All of us will face situations, events, and circumstances that can shake our faith and have doubts <u>cascade</u> all around us.

#### So can there be benefit to my doubt?

- What was Jesus' <u>response</u> to John the Baptist (note Luke 7:21-23)?
- And then...(note Luke 7:24-28).
- Jesus praises John the Baptist despite his doubts.
- Jesus knows even the strongest lovers of God go through times of doubt and <u>darkness</u>.
- He doesn't condemn us.
- He is <u>patient</u> with our doubts.
- He completely paid for any sin that's exposed in our pain. (Bloom)
- In John the Baptist's deepest pain, Jesus sent a promise to strengthen his faith and He will do the same for you and me.
