

Moses had every <u>advantage</u> someone could have in the ancient world... Note **Hebrews 11:24-26**

At some point, Moses understood that his life had a special <u>call</u>/purpose... He committed himself to God's plan for his life, but he did so without an <u>utter</u> sense of dependence on God...

When an I'd rather do it myself attitude permeates my heart and mind, I...

Try to Accomplish Spiritual Things by <u>Human</u> Effort (note <u>Exodus 2:11-12</u>)

<u>God</u> did not tell Moses to kill this Egyptian slave master. In fact, God was planning to deliver the people of Israel without an armed slave rebellion.

Note Exodus 14:13-14; 2:13-14

An *I'd rather do it myself* attitude leads to miscalculations and <u>mistakes</u> on our part.

It causes us to <u>think</u> that we can make things happen... ...and we can, just the wrong things!

Moses may have been *powerful in speech and actions*, well-educated, and an influential member of the royal family, but he couldn't do God's will in his own strength, and neither can we. Note **Galatians 3:3**

2. Try to <u>Hide</u> Our Mistakes

Note Exodus 2:12

...there is very little that ever remains a <u>secret</u> on a human level (note **Exodus 2:14**)...and nothing is <u>secret</u> from God (note **Psalm 139:1-12**).

Concealing our sins/mistakes/failures/weaknesses only <u>delays</u> their discovery (by people), and only <u>delays</u> our dealing with these things with the God who knows everything about us.

3. Try to Run From Our Past and From the <u>Consequences</u> (note <u>Exodus 2:15</u>)

Note Genesis 46:34

Instead of a throne and servants, Moses sat on <u>rockpiles</u> and watched sheep.

Running away preserved Moses' life, but it didn't <u>shield</u> him from his actions...

God never <u>wastes</u> anything.
