

1. Learn that God Works in the Routines of Life

(note **Exodus 3:1**)

40 years/<u>14,600 days</u>

Living on purpose means developing spiritual sensitivity in our daily lives...a spiritual <u>radar</u> that picks up God's activity in the routine, ordinary, mundane schedule of our lives.

In the common, ordinary, everyday circumstances of our lives, God occasionally does something altogether <u>extraordinary</u>. He burns a bush, as it were. (Hamby)

Good followers know that there aren't just coincidences/<u>random</u> events... ...there's a God-ordained <u>plan</u> for our lives and this world.

Because of that, any routine day can contain amazing moments God uses to connect/communicate with us.

2. Are Open to God's Special Interventions (note Exodus 3:2)

Ordinary bush - Literal = <u>thorny</u> shrub = common desert plant. The bush wasn't special...

...what was happening to the bush was amazing/unique.

Note Exodus 3:3

He knew where he was = <u>mountain</u> of God (note **Exodus 3:1**). Good followers look for ways to follow and be open to special ways God uses at times to get our <u>attention</u>.

3. <u>Listen</u> (note Exodus 3:4)

Sometimes we remain <u>clueless</u> about God's purpose for our life because we are unwilling to interrupt the routines of life, deal with our prejudices and fixation on the past, and move towards God.

There are times we need to stop what we're doing, eliminate the noise and static that <u>clutters</u> our minds and hearts, and listen to what God is trying to tell us.

It's me!

There's no record that God had ever spoken to Moses once during the <u>14,</u> <u>600</u> days he spent in Midian...

But good followers understand that God can speak to <u>ordinary</u> people on an average day, so it's important to learn to listen.

Note Exodus 3:5

4. Realize God Gives 2nd Chances

Moses could have easily concluded that 40 years earlier, he had blown his opportunity, and that his life was only going to be lived out in <u>obscurity</u> and lost dreams in the desolation of Midian.

He could have permanently <u>assigned</u> his life to the garbage dump of history.

But God specializes in resurrecting lives.

Note Exodus 3:6

I am the God of <u>failures</u>...I am the God of ordinary/flawed people who were used in extraordinary ways.

Note 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

Note Exodus 3:7-10
