- Icebreaker -

What's a Christmas movie character you find relatable, and why?

- 1. While 'joy' is often referenced at Christmas time, Pastors Aaron and Nate suggested that Christmas sometimes feels "like something to survive." "Does joy feel like an afterthought or fantasy at this point" in your Christmas season?
- 2. Read Luke 2:9-20. "The angels didn't give the shepherds a way to earn joy, they gave them news that produces joy."
 What do you think the difference is between receiving joy and manufacturing joy? How does this tie into the 'Good News' of Christmas and life lived as a Christian?
- **3.** Read Luke 1:46-56. Genuine joy doesn't depend on good circumstances but on God's unchanging Good News. If "joy begins as a response to what God has done", what Godgiven grace can you recall that would redirect your heart and attitude toward joy this Christmas?
- **4.** Read **1 Peter 5:7**. What Joy-Killer(s) will you surrender to God to help you abide in the joy of His Good News? (comparison, hurry, control, cynicism, unmet expectations, etc.
- Read Philippians 4:4. What Joy-Building practice(s) will you establish to help you embrace/nurture the joy of God's Good News? (daily gratitude list, encouraging others, praying with others, celebrating small wins, etc.)


