3. Read **Exodus 32:7-13**. God seeks to shape Moses by confronting him with an opportunity to take the easy road while building his own reputation. But Moses instead pursues God's heart through what he believes to be the best outcome for God's reputation. How has God used confrontation in your life to shape you and draw you closer to His heart?
4. Pastor Tom said, "Confrontation means being willing to risk unpopularity." If this is true, why is obedience to God worth the effort, the risk, the sacrifice?
5. Read **Exodus 32:30-32**. Why do you think a grace-dominated person makes for a good peacemaker?

What is important for us to know and understand about navigating confrontation?

1. Compromising Truth Only Complicates Confrontation

Note **Exodus 32:1, 2-4; 20:2-6**

Under pressure, Aaron tried to compromise his way out of confrontation. His attempt to salvage some level of spiritual commitment was a total failure (note **Exodus 32:5-6**).

Some conflicts can be softened or even avoided by healthy compromise...
...but compromising God's clear truths always creates a mess.

2. God Will Sometimes Confront Us

One definition of *confrontation* = bold challenge.

Note **Exodus 32:7-10**

God told Moses the truth (i.e., the people of Israel had sinned/rebelled and only deserved God's righteous judgment).

God offered Moses the opportunity to be the new Abraham (founder of a nation).

Note **Exodus 2:13-14; 32:11-13**

In the Bible, it is always clear that God's promises and warnings are always conditional on man's response...We are not to think of Moses as altering God's purpose towards Israel by this prayer, but carrying it out: Moses was never more like God than in such moments, for he shared God's mind and loving purpose. (Cole)

3. Confrontation Takes Courage

Confrontation means being willing to risk unpopularity.

4. Confrontation Takes Grace

Effective confrontation happens when people's lives are dominated by grace.

Note **Exodus 32:30-31**

Moses offered his life as a sacrifice (note **Exodus 32:32**).

This is one of the reasons Moses was a type of Christ (i.e., a representative who illustrated what Jesus would do)...

...because Jesus, who is the Great Mediator, offered Himself on the cross to make atonement for His people. (Youngblood)

Conflict is best navigated by people who are grace-inspired, grace-filled, and grace-dominated.
