- Icebreaker -

If you could be the spokesperson for any product on the market, what product would you choose to enthusiastically represent? Come up with a 10-second pitch and give it to the group.

1. When you think of being desperate or desperation in someone else, what are some thoughts that come to mind? Can you think of positive and negative examples of desperation?
2. Think of a time when you experienced something really great and thought that everyone should know about it. What lengths would or did you go to, to ensure that they did? Would you say you were “desperate” to tell people?
3. Just like the example we see in **Mark 2:4**, what was the last thing that you were so desperate to tell or show someone that you wouldn’t let anything get in your way? Why was it so important for you in that moment to become like the people carrying the “mat”?
4. What level of belief (faith) and circumstance would it take for you to cast aside propriety, cultural and social acceptance, and concerns for reputation, that you would even vandalize property to bring someone to meet Jesus? Who would you do that for, or have you, and why?
5. In Jesus, God is desperately reaching out to rescue us from our “mats.” Like the men in **Mark 2:4**, are you willing to become a “mat carrier” and bring people to Jesus? Who is one person in your life who is “paralyzed” (spiritually, emotionally, or otherwise) that you long to see meet Him? Spend some time sharing their name with the group and pray together for them this week.
