*What's one thing that has been
bringing you joy lately?*

1. Why do you go to church: do you see it as an obligation, an option, or is there another reason; and how much of the reason why you go to church is focused on Jesus and not on yourself?
2. Pastor Kyle stated that Jesus, "invites us to build it [the church] with Him" and "He gifts each of us in such a way that we can be co-laborers with Him." What opportunity and gift has Jesus given to you to join Him in this mission?
3. Pastor Kyle said, "If you love Jesus, you'll love what Jesus loves. And Jesus loves the church." But "what do we do when the church hurts us? Or falls short? Or covers stuff up? Because that's real." How do we love what Jesus loves when what Jesus loves can cause heartache? Is there a past hurt done to you by someone through the church or a personal expectation that, guided and empowered by the grace of Jesus, you need to address?
4. When we are awake to grace, The Church becomes to us an invitation from Jesus to be with Jesus. What is an experience you've had with Jesus through your local church that you can share with others when inviting them to church?
5. If belonging to Jesus' Church has seemed to you to be more obligation or option, rather than excitement and desire to be in the presence of Jesus, then to where and to whom do you need to go to create in you a want for Jesus?
