1. Read **Daniel 2**. What are some things you notice about each of the characters?
2. Think of a time when you were subjected to the authority of a good “ruler” vs. a bad “ruler.” What were the differences that set them apart from each other?
3. How are rulers supposed to rule the people under them? How are the people being ruled to relate to those over them?
4. Pastor Kyle said, “the kings in history are subject to the King over history.” What do you think he meant by that and how does this encourage you – how do you become discouraged when you forget it? See **Ephesians 2:20**; **1 Peter 2:6**; **Mark 1:14-15**; **Matthew 28:18**; **Revelations 11:15**.
5. Where is Jesus described in Daniel 2 and what do you learn from it?
6. How is Jesus’ Kingdom different from worldly kingdoms? Consider any of the following: **Isaiah 42:3**; **Matthew 5**; **John 8:1-11**.

Why are these so deceptive and how can we be on guard against them?

Daniel 2:1-40, 44-49

Here's Daniel 2 in one thought - the King over history rules the kings in history.

Daniel wants us to notice 3 differences between the King over history and the kings in history.

1. The kings in history are subject to the King over history.

Daniel 2:20-20a

- Meaning, God's transcendent rule over all the cosmos is not threatened by earthly rulers. God has never once given up a single inch of His authority. In fact, the only reason earthly rulers have any reign at all is because God has delegated it to them. (Note **John 19:11a**; **Romans 13:1b**)
- Nothing we ever go through is outside the jurisdiction of His reign.

2. Kings in history are temporal. The King over history is eternal.

Daniel 2:39a

- That's really good news if you're an exile...because when things are temporary, they're easier to endure and resist.

3. The King over history is Jesus.

- Jesus smashed the kingdoms in history by Himself being smashed.
- Jesus is the King over history that Daniel said would enter into history to rewrite all of history.
