God Made the Sun, Moon, and Stars

OBSERVE the Night Sky

Take your child outside at dusk on a clear night to observe the night sky.

Point out the stars and moon. Remind your child that God made the sun, moon, and stars on the fourth day. Tell that He made the sun to shine during the day and the moon and stars to shine at night. Look up and say a simple prayer thanking God for creating both day and night.

VERSE

"God made everything."

NEHEMIAH 9:6

FIND SHAPES in Clouds

Take your child outside to observe the clouds. Remind your child of the Bible story (reverse side). Explain that because of the light of the sun, we are able to see the beautiful clouds in the sky. Point out any shapes you see in the clouds. Say the Weekly Verse: "God called the light *day* and the darkness *night*. Genesis 1:5."

BABIES

Look at the MOON

Point to the moon in the sky. Tell your child that God made the moon and stars. Read aloud Genesis 1:4-5, 14-19 as you rock your child. Thank God for the sun, moon, and stars.

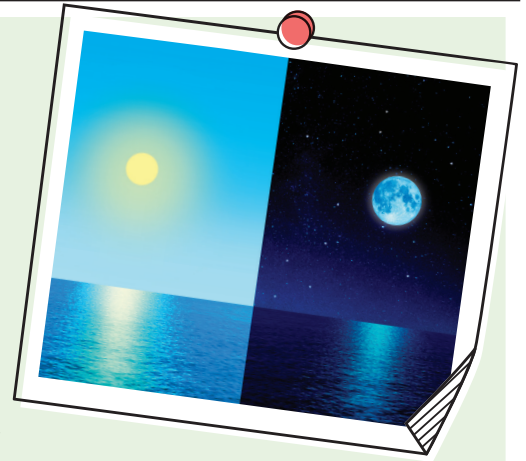
WEEKLY VERSE: God called the light *day* and the darkness *night*.
Genesis 1:5

LIFE POINT: God made the day and night.

In the beginning, there was only darkness. There was no light. God decided to create the world. He said, "Let there be light." Light began to shine. God separated the light from the darkness. God made daytime and nighttime.

God decided to make lights in the sky. The lights would separate the day from the night. The lights would show the seasons and the years. God created a bright sun for the daytime. God created the moon to shine at night. God created many, many stars. Some stars twinkled more brightly than others. God made the stars to shine in the nighttime sky.

God looked at the day and the night. He looked at the sun that would shine brightly in the daytime. He looked at the stars and the moon that would give light in the nighttime. God saw that all He had created was good.

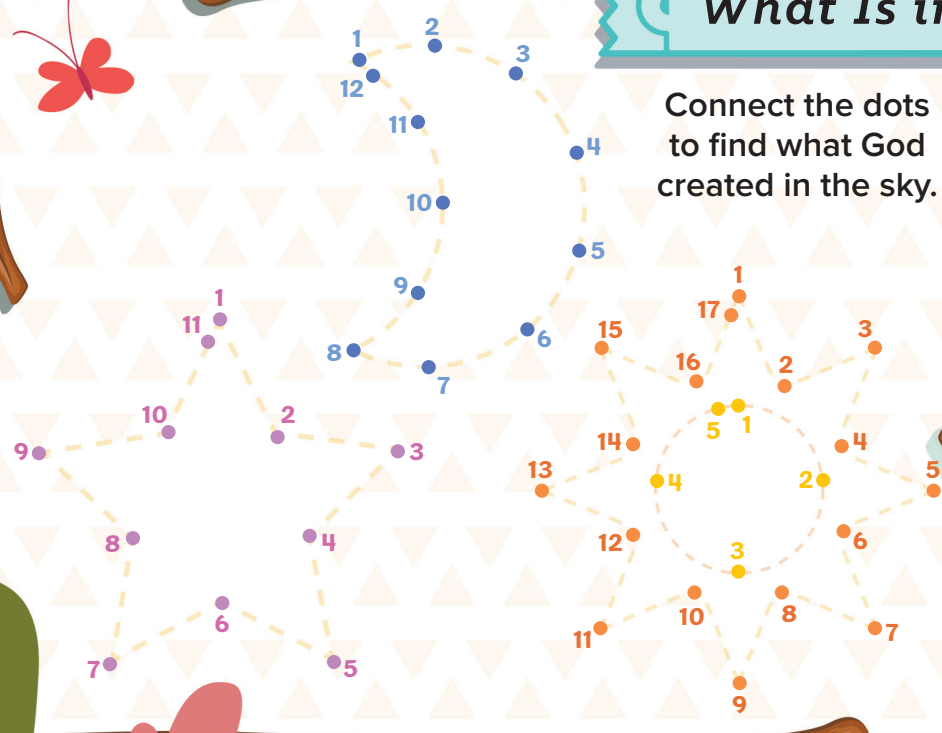

CONVERSATION

God Made the Sun, Moon, and Stars

GENESIS 1:4-5,14-19

Last week you learned that in the beginning, there was God—only God. Nothing else existed. God created the heavens and earth from nothing at all. On the first three days God created light and dark, the sky above the water, the earth, and all kinds of plants and growing things.



When God had created light, He saw that the light was good. God called the light “day,” and the darkness He called “night.”

Then God said, “Let there be lights in the sky to separate the day from the night. They will serve as signs for seasons and for days and years.

So God made the two great lights—the sun to shine in the day and the moon to shine in the night—as well as all the stars.

God placed them in the sky to provide light on the earth. And God saw that it was good.

Say: “Now that there was day and night as well as plants for food, God was ready to create all the animals. Next week, you will hear how God finished His creation.”

Adam and Eve Sinned

GENESIS 2:4-24; 3

God created the world. He had not made it rain yet, so mist came up from the ground to water the earth. There was no man to work the ground. God made the first man out of dust. Then God breathed into the man's nostrils and the man began to breathe!

God planted a garden in Eden. In the middle of the garden God placed the tree of life. The tree of knowledge of good and evil was in the garden too. A river watered the beautiful garden.

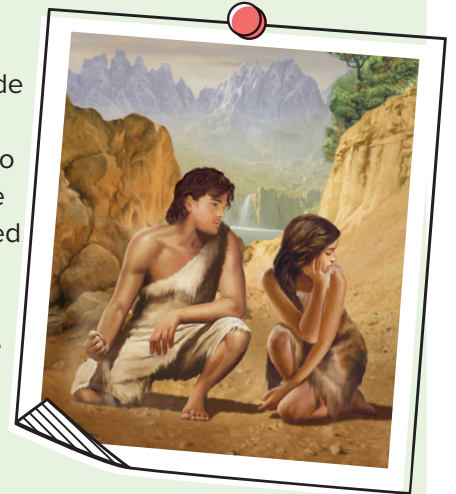
God placed Adam there to care for the garden. God made the animals and birds and let Adam name them. God knew Adam needed a helper. But there was no helper found for him. So God caused Adam to sleep. He took one of Adam's ribs and made a woman. When Adam saw her, he knew she would be his helper. Her name was Eve.

God gave Adam and Eve one command. "You can eat from any tree in the garden except for one," God said. "You must not eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. If you eat the fruit, you will die."

The serpent in the garden was cunning and did not fear God. He told Eve she would not die if she ate the fruit from the tree God said not to eat. Eve knew what God had commanded, but she made the choice to disobey God. She took some of the fruit and ate it. Then she gave some to her husband Adam. He took the fruit and ate it too. Right away they knew they disobeyed God. They were ashamed and sewed fig leaves together to cover themselves because they had no clothes on. They hid from God. God called out to Adam and Eve. He asked them what they had done. Adam and Eve blamed each other and the serpent. God punished each of them. God told Adam and Eve they would have to leave the garden. But God still loved them. He made clothes for them from animal skins.

WEEKLY BIBLE VERSE: Romans 3:23

LIFE POINT: Sin is choosing my way and disobeying God.



THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

Today kids heard that *sin* is "any thought, word, or action that disobeys God." Adam and Eve disobeyed God and brought sin into the world.

LIVE IT OUT

Remind your child that *sin* is "any thought, word, or action that disobeys God." Guide your child to name right and wrong choices that kids might make. Pray with your child that God will guide him to make right choices.

Adam and Eve Sinned

GENESIS 2:4-24; 3

When God created the heavens and the earth, He made a garden called *Eden*. God made beautiful trees that were good for food. In the middle of the garden, God placed the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. The man could eat from any tree in the garden, but God told him not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. If the man ate from that tree, he would die.

God saw the man and said, "It is not good for you to be alone." A deep sleep came over the man. While he slept, God took one of his ribs and used it to form a woman. The man was Adam, and the woman was Eve.

One day a crafty serpent spoke to Eve. "Did God really say, 'You can't eat from any tree in the garden?'"

Eve corrected the serpent. "We may eat fruit from any tree except the one in the middle of the garden. God said, 'You must not touch or eat that fruit, or you will die.'"

The serpent disagreed. "No, you won't die. God knows you will become like Him when you eat from that tree. You will know about good and evil."

Eve looked at the fruit on the tree. She took some of the fruit and ate it. She gave some of the fruit to Adam. He ate it, too. Immediately, Adam and Eve realized what they had done. They tried to cover themselves and hide from God.

That evening God called to Adam, "Where are you?" Adam was hiding. God asked, "Did you eat from the tree I told you not to?"

Adam told God, "The woman You gave me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it."

Eve said, "The serpent tricked me, and I ate it."

God told the serpent, "You are cursed. You will move on your belly and eat dust." Then God told Eve, "You will have great pain when you have a baby." God told Adam, "You must work hard to grow your food now, and one day you will die." Then God made Adam and Eve leave the garden.

The punishment for sin is separation from God.

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



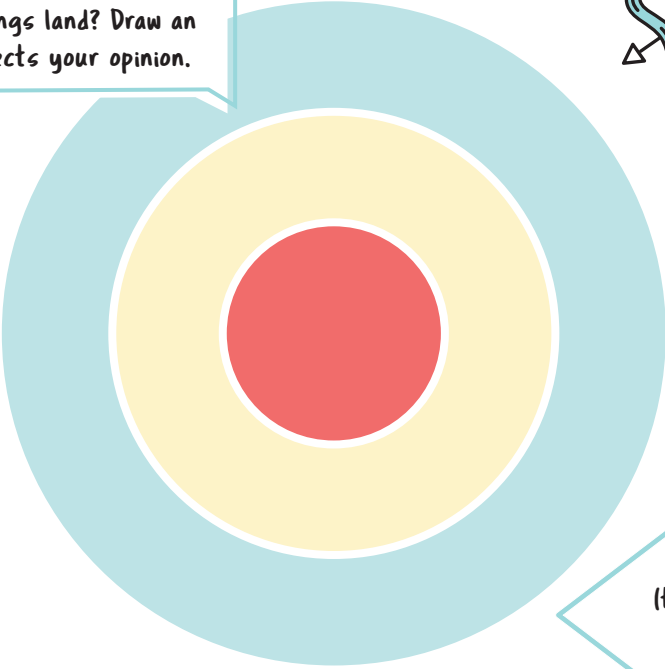
