## LOOK in a MIRROR

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## God Made People

**BASED ON GENESIS 1:26–2:24**

**WEEKLY VERSE:** God made people. *Genesis 1:27*

**LIFE POINT:** God made people to care for the world.



God made a wonderful world. He made day and night, land and water, and plants and trees. God made the sun, moon, and stars. He made animals that live in water, birds, and land animals.

After God made all the land animals on the sixth day, He said, "I will make man. He will be in charge of all the animals. He will take care of the plants I have made."

The man, named Adam, lived in the garden of Eden. God told him to work in the garden and take care of it.

God brought the animals to Adam and said, "Give each animal a name." Adam did what God told him to do.

Then God said the man should not be alone. He made a woman, named Eve, to be Adam's helper. Now Adam would not be alone. God made Adam and Eve different from the other things He made. He made them able to choose to love and obey Him.

Evening came, and the sixth day was done. On the seventh day, God rested. He created everything in six days!

## CONVERSATION

### Adam and Eve Chose

**GENESIS 2:4-24; 3**

God had created the earth and everything on it. He made water, sun, moon, stars, plants, and animals. God had one more thing to create.

On the sixth day, God made animals, and then He made people! He made a man who was able to think and make choices. God put the man in a beautiful garden filled with trees. The garden was named "Eden." God told the man that he could eat the fruit from any of the trees except for one. He was not allowed to eat fruit from that tree.

The man was lonely, so God made a woman. The man and the woman lived happily in the garden. But one day, the serpent told the woman that she would be wise like God if she ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. The woman saw that the tree was beautiful, and she chose to disobey God and eat the fruit. Then she gave some of the fruit to the man, and he disobeyed God and ate some of the fruit too. As soon as they had eaten the fruit, the man and the woman knew they had made a wrong choice. They knew they had disobeyed God. They tried to hide from God.

When God asked what they had done, the man blamed the woman and the woman blamed the serpent for the choices they had made.

God still loved the man and the woman, but He sent them out of Eden and told them that they would have to work hard for the rest of their lives.



#### THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

#### LIVE IT OUT

Review the Bible story with your kindergartner. Tell him that God made people able to make choices, and sometimes people make wrong choices. Name some right and wrong choices with your child.

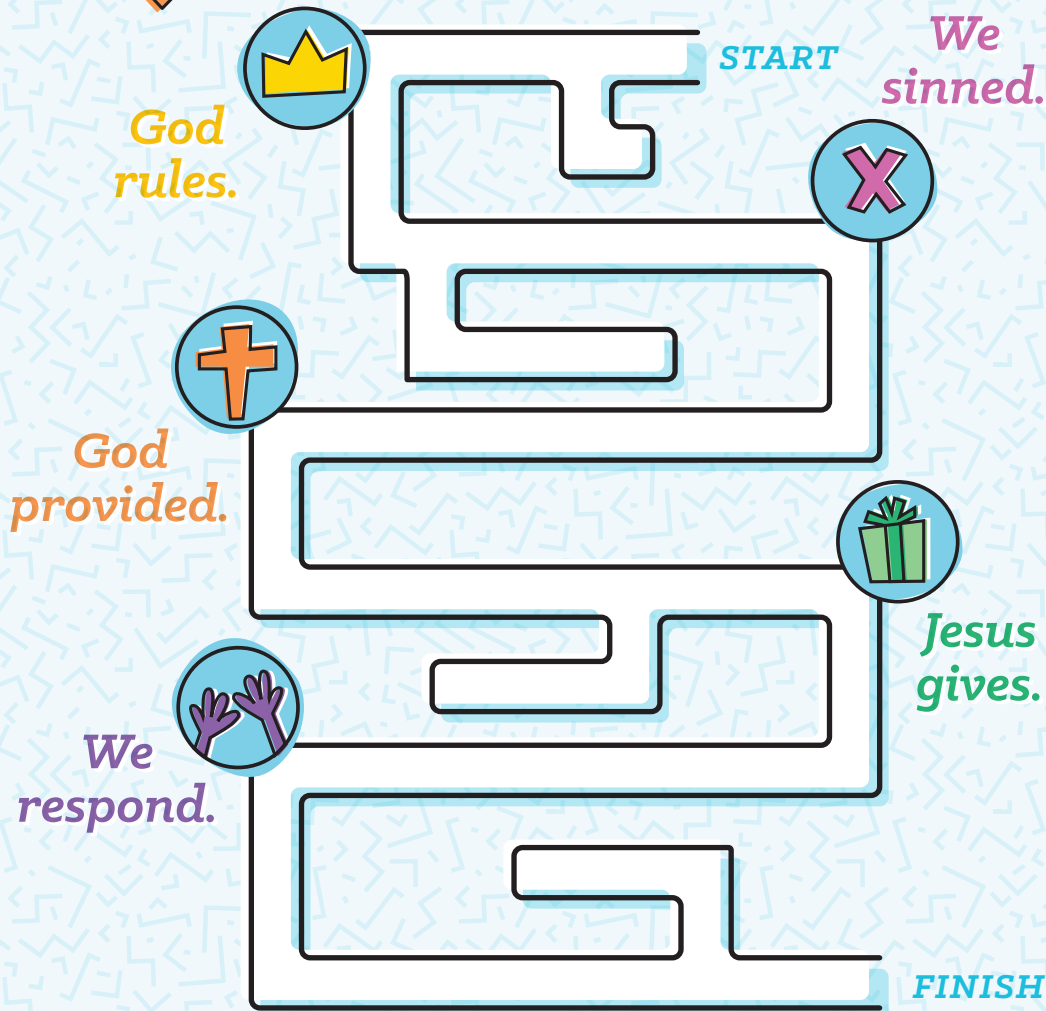

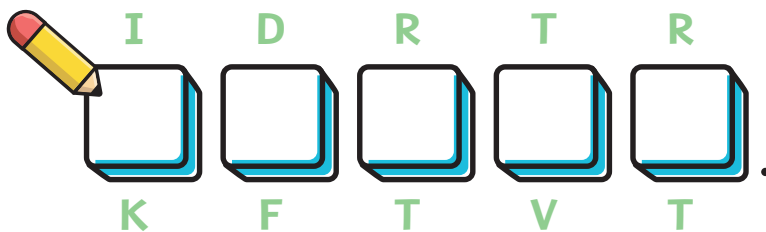

## CONVERSATION

### God Provided the Savior

#### ISAIAH 53

Isaiah was a prophet who lived seven hundred years before Jesus was born. A prophet was a person who spoke God's words of prophecy to a group of people. Through Isaiah, God told His plan to send a Savior who would be Jesus.

Isaiah told that the Savior would be a servant who would suffer and give His life so that people could be forgiven for their sin. Isaiah wrote that people are like sheep who stray from their shepherd. He wrote that people would choose their own way instead of following God.

Isaiah wrote that the Savior would willingly take the punishment that people deserve. God sent His Son, Jesus, to be the Savior.



#### THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

#### LIVE IT OUT

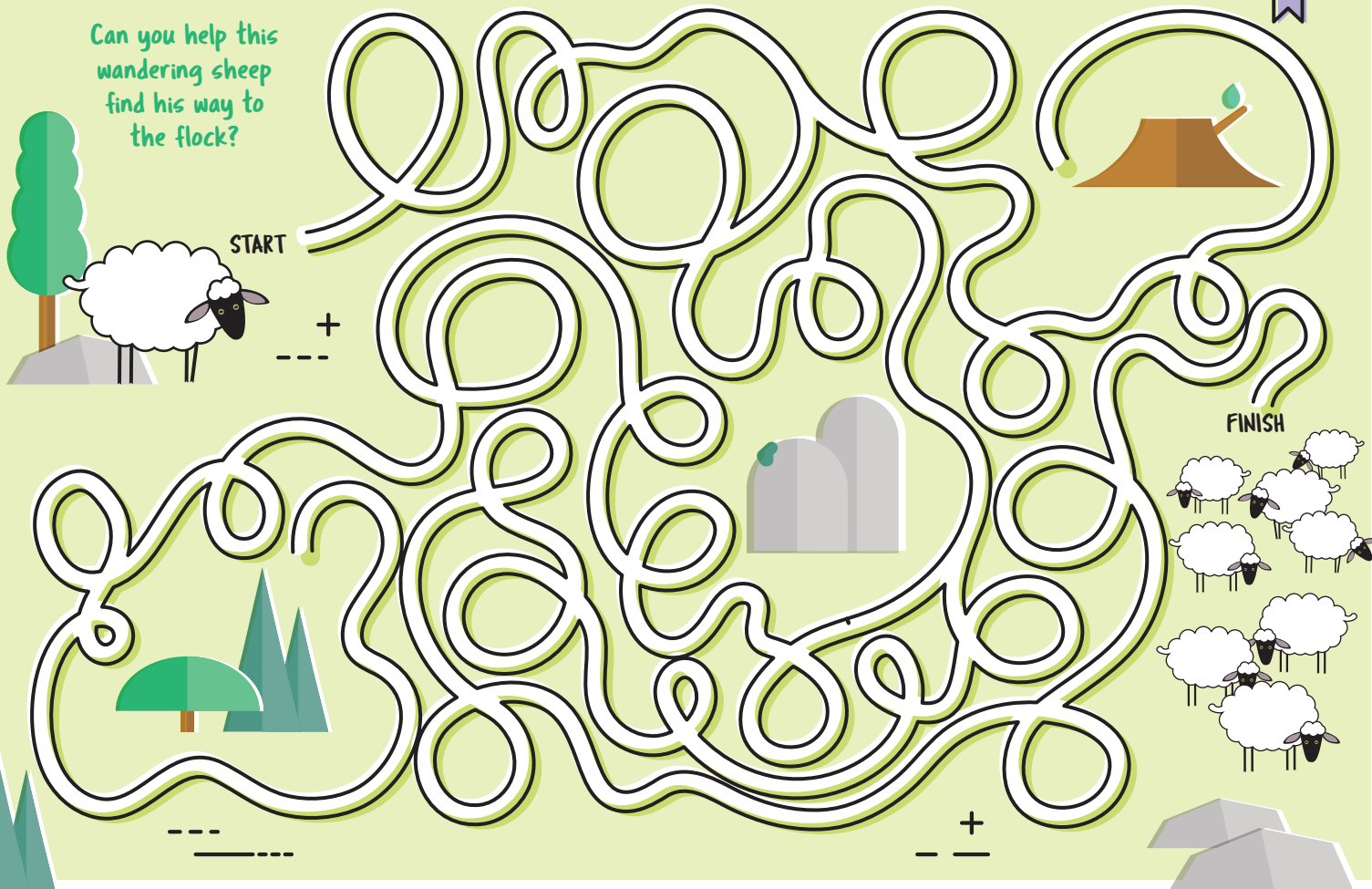
## Wandering Sheep

Isaiah 53:6 tells us that we are all like sheep in the way we wander from God and go our own way. Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God. (Romans 3:23) The Bible calls this *sin*. Our sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death. But wait! There is amazing news! God sent Jesus to come to the earth and take the punishment we deserve!

## CONVERSATION

### God Provided the Savior

#### ISAIAH 53

In Old Testament times God spoke to the people through prophets. Each prophet delivered messages from God to His people. Isaiah was one of these prophets. He told about the coming Messiah almost 700 years before Jesus was born.

God showed Isaiah the kind of Savior who would come. Isaiah understood what God meant and told the people that God's plan was like nothing anyone expected. Isaiah did not describe a mighty warrior. Instead, Isaiah wrote that people would hate and reject the Messiah.

The Messiah would have many sorrows and know great sadness and pain.

Then Isaiah explained that the Messiah would suffer because of us and not because of anything He had done. God planned that the Savior would be wounded to take the punishment for our sins and that the punishment He received would bring us peace and healing.

Isaiah said that all people have disobeyed God and are like sheep who are lost and separated from their shepherd. Isaiah wrote, "All of us are like sheep who have gone astray." He explained that the Messiah would take the punishment that people deserved for following their own way instead of following God.

The Messiah whom Isaiah described would be killed and be buried in a rich man's tomb, even though He had done nothing wrong. Everything that Isaiah said came true in the life and death of Jesus hundreds of years later. The words Isaiah spoke showed God's plan to provide the way for us to be saved through Jesus.
