

BABIES

Go for a RIDE

Place your baby in a stroller to go for a walk. Mention that the Ethiopian man was riding in a chariot. Tell the Bible story (reverse side) as you push your baby. Say: "Philip told the good news about Jesus. Acts 8:35. People use the Bible to tell about Jesus."

PLAY in SAND

Pour some play sand in a shallow container. Let your child scoop and pour the sand with cups and spoons. Mention that Philip walked along a desert road. Say that a desert road is sandy. Tell the Bible story. State that people use the Bible to tell people about Jesus.








BASED ON ACTS 8:26-40

WEEKLY VERSE: Philip told the good news about Jesus. *Acts 8:35*

LIFE POINT: People use the Bible to tell about Jesus.

Philip traveled from town to town, telling people about Jesus. One day an angel (a messenger from God) spoke to Philip. The angel told Philip to go to the desert road that went from Jerusalem to Gaza.

As Philip walked down the road, he saw a man from Ethiopia riding in a chariot. The man had been to Jerusalem to worship God. Philip heard him reading from a Bible scroll. Philip asked the man if he understood what he was reading.

The man said, "I need someone to explain the words to me." Philip sat beside him in the chariot. He told the man that the words in the Bible scroll were about Jesus. He told him the good news about Jesus.



Philip Told a Man About Jesus

ACTS 8:26-40

"Go south to the Gaza road," an angel told Philip.

When Philip was on the road, he saw a man from the country of Ethiopia. The man was traveling in a chariot. He had been in Jerusalem to worship God. Now he was reading aloud from a scroll the words of the prophet Isaiah.

The angel told Philip, "Go to the chariot."

Philip went up to the man. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked.

"How can I unless someone helps me?" the Ethiopian man replied. He asked Philip to sit in the chariot.

The man asked Philip to explain who Isaiah was writing about.

Philip used the Scripture that the man had been reading, and told him about Jesus. The Ethiopian man became a believer.





ACTS 8:26-40

One day, an angel came to Philip with a message from God: "Go to the road from Jerusalem to Gaza." Right away, Philip went to the road.

Philip saw an Ethiopian man traveling in a chariot. The man was an important official for the queen of the Ethiopians. The man was on his

way home. As he was sitting in his chariot, he read aloud from the Scriptures in Isaiah.

The Holy Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot." Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading from the book of Isaiah. Philip said, "Do you understand what you're reading?"

The Ethiopian said, "No! How can I understand unless someone helps me? Will you come sit in my chariot and help me?"

Philip knew the part of Isaiah the man was reading. (Read aloud verses 32-33 from your Bible.)

The Ethiopian asked Philip, "Who is the prophet talking about?" Philip began to teach the man the good news about Jesus, starting with the Scripture the man had been reading.


As the men were traveling down the road, they came to some water. The Ethiopian asked, "What would keep me from being baptized in this water?"


The Ethiopian stopped the chariot. Both men went down to the water. Philip baptized the man.

When the men came up out of the water, God suddenly carried Philip away. The Ethiopian could no longer see him, but he went away happy because He knew and believed in God. Philip later appeared in another town, preaching about Jesus.

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CONVERSATION

An Ethiopian Heard the Gospel

ACTS 8:26-40

An angel spoke to Philip, "Get up and go to the road that leads from Jerusalem to Gaza." Philip left the place he had been preaching to obey the command.

Philip came to the desert road and saw an important man from Ethiopia riding in his chariot. He

worked for Candace, the queen, and was

in charge of her money. The Ethiopian man had come to Jerusalem to worship and now was headed home. Philip noticed that the man was reading aloud from a scroll with words written by the prophet Isaiah.

God's Spirit told Philip to join the chariot. Philip ran alongside the chariot and asked, "Do you understand the words you are reading?"

The Ethiopian man said, "How can I unless someone guides me?" He invited Philip to climb up and sit next to him in the chariot. The Ethiopian was reading about a man: "He was taken to be killed, and just like a lamb is quiet while it is being sheared, He never opened His mouth. Even though He was unfairly accused, His life was taken."

The Ethiopian man asked, "Is the prophet writing about himself or someone else?" Philip explained that the words were about Jesus. Philip used Isaiah's words written on the scroll to tell the man the good news about Jesus.

As the Ethiopian man and Philip traveled down the road, they came to some water. The Ethiopian asked, "Is there anything to keep me from being baptized?"

Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, you may!"

Philip baptized the Ethiopian man, and he joyfully continued on his way home. God's Spirit took Philip to another place, where he kept on preaching about Jesus.



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
An Ethiopian Heard the Gospel



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
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
