CONVERSATION

Solomon and the People Worshiped

1 KINGS 6; 8

Solomon was King David's son. King David wanted to build a temple for the people to gather and worship God. God told King David that his son, Solomon, would build the temple. (1 Chronicles 22:5-10) When Solomon became king, he began to build God's temple.

While Solomon was building the temple, God spoke to him. God said, "If you obey Me and keep My commands,

I will keep all My promises to you. I will be your God. I will never leave My people." Solomon continued building the temple. He used stone, wood, and gold to build the temple. After seven years of work, the temple was complete.

Solomon gathered all the people to worship God at the temple. The leaders brought the ark of the covenant to the temple. The ark of the covenant was a wooden box covered in gold. (Exodus 37:1-2) The stone tablets of the Ten Commandments were inside the golden box. (Exodus 40:20) The leaders placed the ark of the covenant inside the temple.

Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in front of all the people who gathered to worship God. He spread out his hands and prayed, "God, there is no God like You. You keep all Your promises. You listen when Your people pray. You forgive sin. You care for Your people. You are the one true God."

When Solomon had finished praying, he turned and blessed the people. He reminded them that God keeps His promises. He told them to obey God and keep God's commands. Solomon and the people worshiped God. They celebrated God's goodness for fourteen days. On the fifteenth day, Solomon sent the people home. They went home with happy hearts for all the good things that God had done.






