Lay out all the items and talk about how parents use the items to take care of children. Tell the Bible story. (reverse side) Say: "The Bible tells parents and other family members to take care of children."

Look in a MIRROR


Hold a hand mirror so your baby can see himself. Say: "God made you. God planned for you to be in our family. Abraham and Sarah had a baby named Isaac. God planned for him to be in their family." Pray, thanking God for your child. Show love to others.

Prepare your child for bed. Comment about the things you do to help take care of your child (give a bath, brush teeth, put on clothes, etc.). Tell the Bible story (reverse side). Mention that God wants parents and other family members to take care of children. Pray with your child before she goes to sleep. Thank God that you can take care of your child.







Abram loved God and did what God said. God had made promises to Abram. He promised Abram that he would have a large family, but Abram and his wife Sarai (SEHR igh) did not have any children. They were very old and thought they were too old to have a baby. They wondered how God would give them a big family.

God spoke to Abram and changed his name to Abraham. God changed Sarai's name, too. Her new name would be Sarah. God told Abraham that Sarah would have a son. Abraham laughed at the idea that Sarah would have a son when she was 90 and he was 100 years old! But he knew God kept His promises. God told Abraham to name their son Isaac.

A year later, Sarah had a baby boy, just like God had said. Abraham and Sarah named their son Isaac as God had told them. They had waited for God's promise to happen. God did what He had promised to do.

Paul Wrote About Families

EPHESIANS 5:22-33; 6:1-4

While Paul was in prison in Rome, he wrote a letter to the Christians who lived in the city of Ephesus. Paul wanted to encourage them to love others like Jesus did.

In Paul's letter he wrote specific instructions about God's plan for families. He challenged families to honor Jesus by treating one another respectfully.



Paul explained that marriage is a picture of Jesus and the church. Paul reminded the people that Jesus loved the church and gave His life for the church. Paul challenged the husbands to follow Jesus' example and love their wives as much as they love themselves. He told the wives to respect their husbands as the head of the home, like Jesus is the head of the church.

Paul instructed children to obey their parents in the Lord because it is one of God's commands and the right thing to do. Paul told parents not to frustrate their children or make them angry or resentful. Instead, parents should provide loving discipline and training in the ways of the Lord.
