
When Jesus saw that the fishermen were not catching any fish, He helped them. Soon, the men caught so many fish their nets began to break!

FIND the NAME


God's Son, Jesus, did things that no one else could do.

Jesus Helped the Fishermen

BASED ON LUKE 4:42-5:11

WEEKLY VERSE: God sent His only

Son, Jesus. 1 John 4:9

LIFE POINT: Jesus did things that

no one else could do.

One day Jesus was standing by a lake. He was teaching people about God. All the people

were crowding around Him.

Jesus saw two boats nearby. One of the boats belonged to Simon Peter. Jesus got into Simon's boat. Jesus asked him to take the boat away from the shore so the people could see Jesus. Jesus sat in the boat and taught the people.

When Jesus finished teaching, He told Simon, "Go out into the deep water. Let down your nets to catch some fish."

Simon said, "Jesus, we have fished all night and have not caught any fish. But because You say so, I will do it."

Simon threw the nets into the water. When Simon tried to pull the nets into the boat, they were so full of fish that they began to break. Simon waved to the fishermen in the other boat to come help him. They worked together to pull the heavy nets into the boats. Simon and his friends, James and John, were amazed when they saw all the fish Jesus helped them catch!



VERSE





CONVERSATION

Jesus Chose Disciples

LUKE 4:42-5:11,27-31; 6:12-19

A new day had begun in the city of Capernaum (kuh PER nee um). The day before, Jesus spent much of His time healing and speaking to large crowds of people in the city. Today Jesus wanted to spend time in a quiet place. However, the people kept Him from leaving. They crowded around Jesus to hear more of God's Word.

As more and more people gathered,
Jesus looked and saw two boats on
the edge of Lake Gennesaret (gen nay sa
RET). One of the boats belonged to a fisherman
named Simon. Simon let Jesus get onto his boat so that Jesus could
teach the growing crowd from just offshore.

When Jesus had finished speaking, He told Simon to take the boat out into deeper water and to let down his nets to catch fish. Unsure, Simon replied, "Teacher, we spent all night fishing and didn't catch anything. But if You say so, I'll give it a try."

When Simon let down the nets, he caught so many fish that he had to call his friends to come and help him fill two boats. Both boats were so full that they began to sink!

Everyone who saw this catch was amazed, including James and John, Simon's fishing partners. Jesus told Simon, "Don't be afraid. From now on, you will be catching people."

Simon, John, and James brought the boats to land. They left everything and followed Jesus. Later, Jesus saw a tax collector named Levi, also called Matthew. He called out to Matthew, "Follow Me." And Matthew did.

Matthew joined Jesus along with eleven other men. Jesus chose these twelve men to be His disciples: Simon (whom Jesus named Peter), Peter's brother Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Simon, Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot.
