Paint your child's hands with washable paint. Help her press them onto paper. Repeat the process with her feet. Talk about God making people special. Tell the Bible story (reverse side).

LOOK in the MIRROR




After God made all the land animals on the sixth day, He said, "I will make man. He will be in charge of all the animals. He will take care of the plants I have made."

The man lived in the garden of Eden. God told him to work in the garden and take care of it.


God brought the animals to the man and said, "Give each animal a name." The man did what God told him to do.


Cain and Abel

GENESIS 4:1-16

God made Adam and Eve, the first man and woman. They lived in the garden of Eden with God until they sinned and disobeyed Him. (Genesis 1–3)

After God sent Adam and Eve out of the garden, they had two sons, Cain and Abel. When the boys grew up, Cain became a farmer who worked the ground, and Abel became a shepherd who cared for flocks.

When the time came to make an offering to the Lord, Cain presented some of his crops, and Abel offered some



of the firstborn animals from his flock. God was pleased with Abel's offering and accepted it, but God did not approve of Cain's offering. This made Cain very angry, and his anger showed on his face.

God spoke to Cain, "Why are you so angry? If you do what is right, won't you be accepted? If you do not do what is right, sin is at your door. You must control it."

Cain told Abel, "Let's go out to the field." While they were there, Cain attacked his younger brother and killed him.

Later, God asked Cain, "Where is your brother, Abel?"

"I do not know," Cain replied. "Am I supposed to watch over my brother?"
