VERSE

Do what God says.
DEUTERONOMY 5:32

BANDAGE Toys

Gather dolls, action figures, and/or toy animals, paper towels, and a toy doctor kit (optional). Cut or tear paper towels into strips to make bandages. Engage in play, pretending to bandage the toys with the strips of paper towel.

Mention that God can do anything. Say that God healed a man named Naaman. Tell the Bible story (reverse side) as you play with your child.



ROLE PLAY the Bible Story

Using household items creatively, play out the Bible story (reverse side) with your child. Let your child play the part of Naaman. Invite her to dress up as Naaman in soldier attire (plastic bowl helmet, pool noodle sword, and paper plate shield). Recite the Weekly Verse together: "Nothing is too hard for God. Jeremiah 32:17."

BABIES

Enjoy WATER PLAY

Pour a small amount of water into a shallow plastic container. Invite your baby to touch and softly tap the water in the container. Sing to the tune of "Are You Sleeping?": "Tap the water. / Tap the water. / Can you tap? / Can you tap? / You can tap the water. / You can tap the water. / Tap, tap, tap. / Tap, tap, tap." Tell the Bible story (reverse side). State: "God made Naaman well. God can do anything!"

LIFE POINT: God can do anything.



BABIES

Naaman had a skin problem that bothered him. He wanted to be well.

Naaman went to the prophet Elisha to ask for help.

Elisha told him to wash in the Jordan River.

When Naaman washed in the river, he was made well (healed).

Naaman had a skin disease. Naaman wanted to be well.

Naaman went to see Elisha, the prophet.

Elisha sent him a message to go wash in the Jordan River.

Naaman finally washed in the river as Elisha told him to do.

Elisha was healed! His skin disease was gone.

2s

Naaman was a commander of the army for the king. He was an important man and a strong warrior, but he had a skin disease.

Naaman heard about a prophet (a person who told people what God wanted them to know) that could make him well.

Naaman went to the house of the prophet named Elisha. Elisha sent a message to Naaman to go wash seven times in the Jordan River.

At first Naaman did not do it. Then he went to the river and washed like Elisha told him to do.

Naaman was healed! His skin disease was gone.

THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

The Bible story teaches that God can do anything. A servant girl told Naaman to go to the prophet Elisha to heal his disease. God healed Naaman after Naaman obeyed what God told him to do.

LIVE IT OUT

Review the Bible story. Say that God can do anything. Recall other stories in which God performed miracles, such as the story of Jonah and the big fish, the Israelites crossing the Red Sea, and Jesus or the disciples healing sick people.

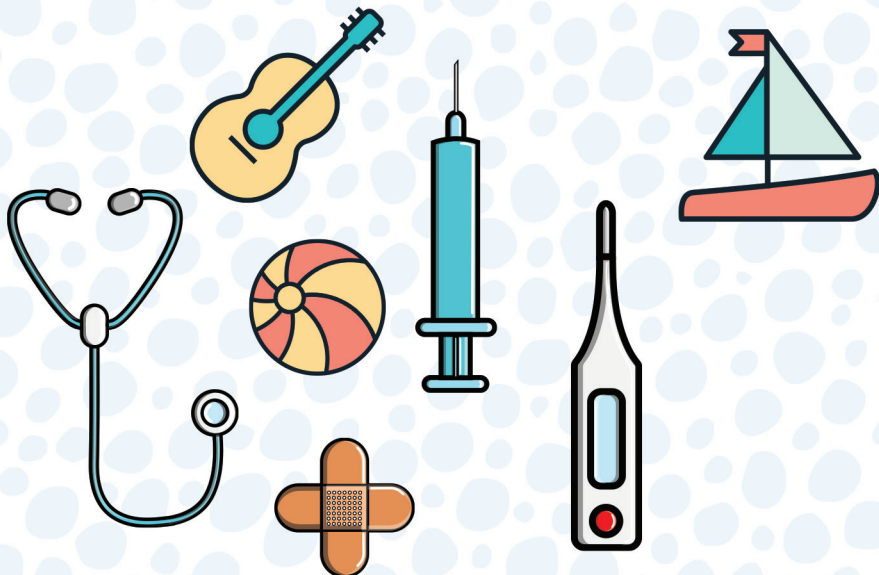

CONVERSATION

God Healed Naaman

BASED ON 2 KINGS 5:1-17

WEEKLY VERSE: Nothing is too hard for God. *Jeremiah 32:17*

LIFE POINT: God can do anything.

Naaman was a commander in a king's army. He was a brave man, and many people followed him. But Naaman had a skin disease.

Naaman's wife had a young girl who worked for her. The girl said to Naaman's wife, "If Naaman would go to the prophet Elisha, he would heal Naaman's skin disease."

So Naaman traveled to another country to see the prophet Elisha. A prophet is a person who told people what God wanted them to know. Elisha sent out his messenger, who said to Naaman, "Go wash in the river seven times, and you will be healed from your disease."

Naaman was angry. He left saying, "Why didn't Elisha come out and help me? Don't we have better rivers in our country?" Then Naaman left.

Naaman's helpers said, "If the prophet Elisha told you to do something hard, you would do it. Why won't you wash yourself in the river?"

So Naaman went to the river and washed in it seven times as Elisha had told him. When he came out of the river after the seventh time, his sores were gone.

Naaman returned to Elisha's house. "Thank you," he said. "Now I know that there is only one true God in the whole world."

CONVERSATION

God Judged the Philistines

1 SAMUEL 4:1-11; 5-6

Because God was not with the Israelites due to their disobedience, they were losing a war against their enemies, the Philistines. The Israelites were desperate without God's help. So, without praying to God, the leaders of Israel decided, "Let's bring the ark of the covenant with us so that we will be saved from

our enemies." The ark was a beautiful gold chest, a symbol of God's power and presence.

When the ark was brought to the army's camp, the Israelites shouted so loud, the ground shook! The Philistines heard their war cries and were afraid. "Who will rescue us from this God?" they said to one another. "Show some courage! Fight!"

And fight they did! The Philistines captured the ark of the covenant and brought it to their temple in Ashdod, where there was a statue of the false god Dagon. When the Philistines got up the next morning, the statue of Dagon had fallen on its face in front of the ark. The Philistines put the statue back, but the next morning Dagon's statue had fallen again, with its head and hands broken off!

The Philistines in Ashdod sent the ark to another city—Gath. That caused a great panic. God caused everyone in Gath to be covered with sores. The Philistines in Gath sent the ark to the Philistines in Ekron. The Ekronites were afraid. "Send the ark of Israel's God away! It must return to its place, so it won't kill us!"

After seven months, the Philistines put the ark on a cart with two cows. They waited and watched. "If the cart goes toward its homeland," they decided, "then we will know it is the Lord who has punished us."

Off went the cart, straight back to the Israelites! Mooing as they went, the cows did not stray to the right or the left. The Israelites were joyful when the ark returned. They chopped up the cart and worshiped God with sacrifices and offerings.

WEEKLY BIBLE VERSE: 2 Chronicles 20:6

LIFE POINT: God is over all things that happen.



THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

Through this Bible story your child discovered that God is over all things that happen. The Philistines captured the ark of the covenant, and God severely judged them until they returned the ark to the Israelites.

LIVE IT OUT

Read 2 Chronicles 20:6 with your child. Use a calendar to look at your plans for the week and pray about them. Help your child understand that God acts in all situations, and He already knows what will happen. Remind your child that God is all-powerful and in control of all things.
