God Helped Gideon



CLAP and March

Invite your child to clap and march around the house. Tell him you are pretending to be soldiers. Talk about how God helped choose the soldiers in the Bible story. Point to the Bible story picture (reverse side). Explain that the soldiers used horns and torches with fire to win the battle. Tell your child that God is good and helps us, too.

BUILD a Tent

BABIES

Take a **LISTENING** Walk

Tell your baby the Bible story. Comment: "Gideon and his soldiers listened to God and did what He said." Tuck your baby in a stroller or carry her on a walk. Encourage her to listen. Point out leaves rustling in the breeze, the happy songs or chatter of birds, a dog barking, or a car horn blowing. Say: "Thank You, God, for ears to hear. Thank You for being good to us."

Help your child build a tent with sheets or blankets. Sit inside together as you tell the Bible story (reverse side). Remind your child that many soldiers went back to their tents. Invite your child to rest in the tent. Enjoy playing and resting in the tent.

MAIN POINT: God is good.



BABIES

Gideon had too many soldiers.

He sent some home.

God told Gideon to keep the 300 men who drank water from their hands. Gideon sent the others soldiers back to the tents.

Gideon and his soldiers did what God told them to do and won the battle.



Gideon had a large army. God told him he had too many men. Gideon told the soldiers who were afraid that they could go home. Many left.

Gideon then told the soldiers to drink water.

Gideon kept the 300 men who used their hands to drink water. Gideon and the soldiers went to battle carrying horns and torches. They yelled loudly and the other armies were afraid and ran away. God led Gideon to win the battle.



Gideon had a large army. God told Gideon he had too many soldiers. God said to tell the soldiers if they were afraid that they could return home. Many men went home.

There were still 10,000 men ready to go to battle.

God told Gideon to tell the soldiers to drink water. God told Gideon which men to keep.

Gideon sent many soldiers back to the tents. He kept the 300 men who used their hands to drink water.

The soldiers did exactly what Gideon told them to do. They blew their horns, held torches high, and yelled loudly.

Gideon's army won the battle because God helped them.

God Helped Gideon

BASED ON JUDGES 7:1-22

WEEKLY VERSE: I am God, and no one

else is like Me. Isaiah 46:9

LIFE POINT: God is good.

A group of people called Midianites (MID in uhn ights) were causing trouble for the Israelites. They would steal crops and animals so the Israelites could not eat. The Israelites prayed to God and asked Him for help.

God chose Gideon to help the people. An angel appeared to Gideon and said, "God is with you. Go and save your people from the Midianites."

Gideon said, "But I am not powerful or strong. I cannot do this." The angel told him, "God will be with you and give you the victory."

Gideon gathered his men, but God told Gideon he had too many men in his army. God did not want them to think they won the battle because they had a lot of strong men in their army.


God told Gideon to go with only 300 men. He chose them by how they drank water from a stream. Each man was told to take a trumpet and a torch. The light of each torch was hidden by a clay pitcher that covered it. God told Gideon exactly what to do.


Gideon and his men surrounded the Midianites' camp. When Gideon gave the signal, the men blew their trumpets, smashed their pitchers, and shouted, "For the Lord and for Gideon!"

The Midianites in the camp were confused by all the noise because it was late at night and very dark. They began to fight with one another and run away. Gideon and his men followed them and defeated them. God helped Gideon win the battle.


CONVERSATION

Gideon and the Midianites

JUDGES 6:11-7:22

For seven years the Midianites ruled over God's people, the Israelites. The Midianites attacked the Israelites and destroyed their crops. The Israelites hid in the mountains. (Judges 6:1-10)

One day Gideon was threshing (beating) wheat in his hiding place when an angel of God visited him. "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior!" the angel said. "You will save your people from the Midianites."



Gideon answered, "How can I save Israel? My family is poor. I am the youngest in my family."

"I will be with you," God promised. "You will strike down the Midianites as if they were only one man."

Gideon gathered 32,000 men, but God said, "You have too many soldiers. Tell those who are afraid to go home." Thousands of men left, and only 10,000 stayed to fight.

God said, "There are still too many men. Take them down to the water and watch how they drink. Place in one group the men who scoop up water with their hands and lap it with their tongues like dogs. Place those who kneel to drink straight from the water in another group." Gideon obeyed God. Only 300 men drank with their hands to their mouths. God told Gideon, "I will help you defeat the Midianites with these 300 men. Send the rest home."

God helped Gideon know what to do. God told Gideon to give every man a trumpet and an empty pitcher with a torch inside. Gideon directed the men to surround the enemy camp. When Gideon blew his trumpet, the men broke the pitchers, blew their trumpets, and shouted, "For the Lord and for Gideon!"

The Midianites were terrified. God confused the Midianites, who began to fight one another and run away. Gideon and the Israelites won the battle!
