

PLAY with Animals

Gather toy animals for your child to play with. Show and name each animal. Talk about the different places the animals live. Make the animal sounds with your child. Show the Bible story picture (reverse side). Tell the Bible story. Pray, thanking God for His care for animals and people.

BABIES

SIT in a Cardboard Boat

Cut off the top flaps of a large cardboard box. Cut down the middle of one end of the box to make two flaps. Push these flaps out to make a V-shape and tape together. Invite your baby to sit in the pretend boat as you tell the Bible story. Comment: "God cared for Noah, his family, and the animals. He cares for all He made. He cares for our family, too. We can thank God as Noah did." Pray, thanking God for His love and care.

ENJOY Bath Time

Provide toy boats and animals during bath time. Use plastic food containers as boats as well. Talk about how Noah built a large boat called an ark. Tell that God told Noah to put at least two of every kind of animal inside the boat. Tell the remaining part of the Bible story (reverse side). Closely watch your child as they play. Explain that God cared for Noah's family and God cares for your family, too!

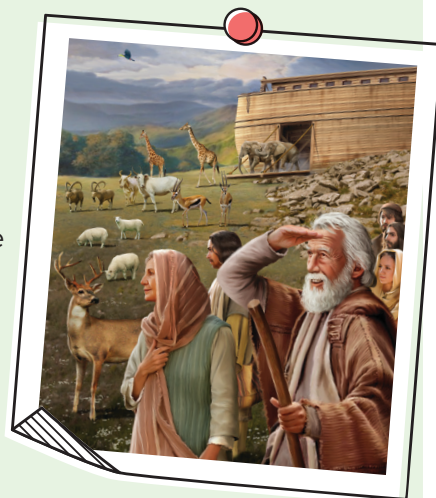

DRAW LINES to match the pairs of animals.

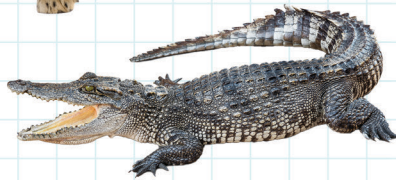
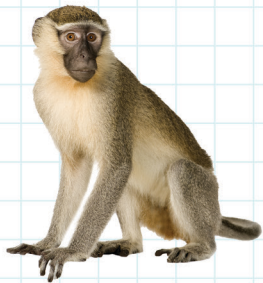
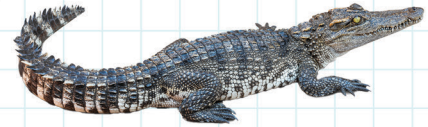

God Helped Noah

**BASED ON GENESIS 6:9–8:19;

WEEKLY VERSE: God made us, and we are His. *Psalm 100:3*

LIFE POINT: God cares for people and for His world.

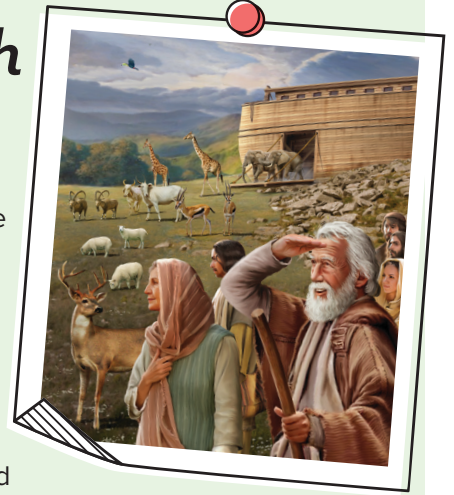
Noah loved and obeyed God. One day God told Noah to build a big boat called an ark. He told Noah how to build the ark and how big to make it. God told Noah that it would rain for many days and flood the whole earth.

Noah built the ark with three floors and one door. When the ark was finished, God told Noah to store food for his family and all the animals. Noah did exactly what God told him to do!

God told Noah to take at least two of every kind of animal into the ark. Noah, his family, and the animals went into the ark. Then God shut the door.

Rain began to fall. It rained for 40 days and 40 nights, but Noah and his family were safe inside the ark. When the rain finally stopped, Noah waited for the water to dry up. One day God told Noah to come out of the ark. Noah's family and all the animals walked out. Noah thanked God for taking care of him and his family.

After the rain stopped and the water went away, God put a rainbow in the sky to remind Noah and his family that He would never flood the earth again.

BALLOON POP

CONVERSATION

Saved from the Flood

GENESIS 6:9–9:17

In Noah's day the people were evil. They did many wrong things and had sinful thoughts. Noah was not like the people. He was a good and righteous man who obeyed and honored God.

God told Noah, "Because the people are evil, I have decided to put an end to everything on earth. Make an ark for you and your family. Use gopher wood and build the ark 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high. Cover the ark with sticky pitch to make it waterproof. Take your family on the ark. Take seven pairs of every clean animal and one pair of every unclean animal. Also, pack food for all of you."

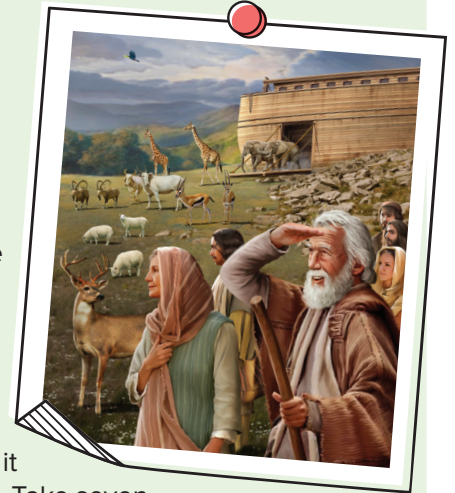
Noah followed God's instructions very carefully. Two of each animal came to Noah and entered the ark, just as God had commanded. When Noah's family and the animals were on the ark, God safely shut them in, and the rain began. It rained for 40 days and 40 nights. The earth was flooded, and water covered everything. After the rain stopped, the water was on the land for 150 days.

Everyone in the ark was safe. After the water went down, the ark landed safely on a mountain. Noah waited 40 days and then opened the window and sent out a raven. The raven flew back and forth until the waters dried up. Then Noah sent out a dove, but it came back to the ark because it could not find a dry place to rest. After seven more days Noah sent out the dove again. This time it came back with an olive leaf in its beak. A week later, Noah sent out the dove again, and this time it did not return. Noah opened the ark and found that the ground was drying up.

When it was time, God told Noah and his family to come out of the ark. Noah built an altar, and he and his family worshiped God. God promised that He would never again destroy every living thing on the earth with floodwaters. He placed a rainbow in the sky as a sign of His promise.

WEEKLY BIBLE VERSE: Psalm 24:1

LIFE POINT: God is in control of all creation.



THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

The Bible story showed your child how God is in control of all creation. God decided to send a flood. Out of millions of people on earth God chose to save only one family—Noah's.

LIVE IT OUT

Review the Bible story and tell your child to think of ways God controls His creation. Open the Bible and read Psalm 24:1 together.

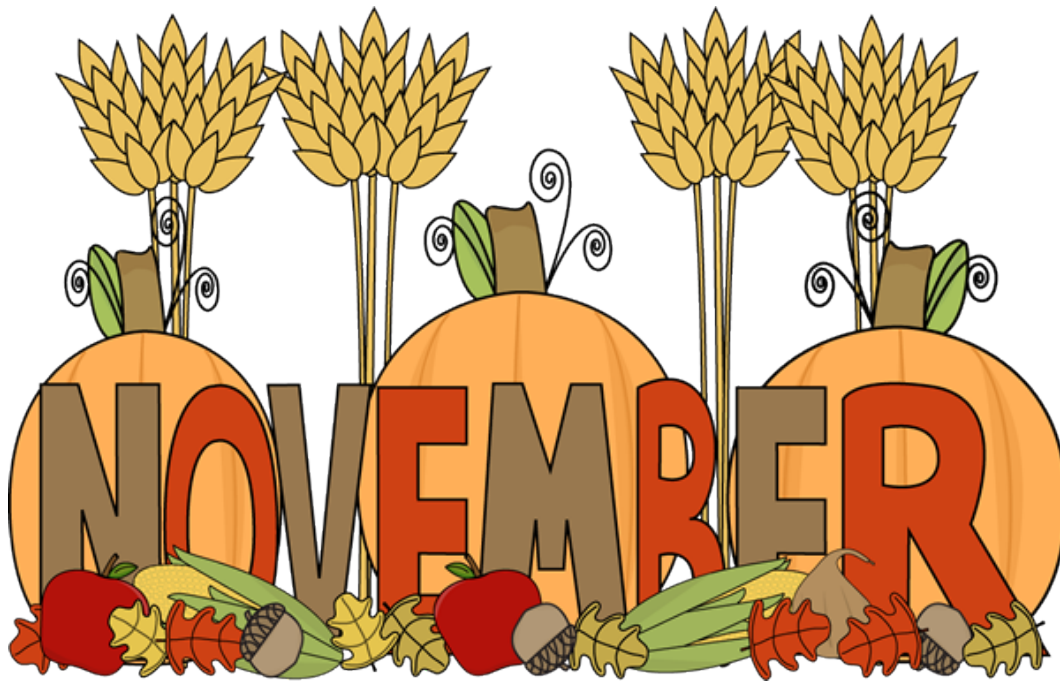
