

Jesus Was Born

VERSE

Jesus was born in Bethlehem.

MATTHEW 2:1

MAKE a Manger

Tell the Bible story (reverse side). Gather a baby doll, shoe box (that doll will fit in), and a blanket. Swaddle the doll with the blanket and let your child place it in the manger (box). Remind your child that Baby Jesus was placed in a manger—a container that held food for animals. State: "Mary wrapped Jesus in cloth and laid Him in a manger. Luke 2:7."

FIND Bibles

Talk about the Bible story (reverse side). Remark that shepherds hurried to see Jesus when they heard He had been born. Mark Luke 2 in several Bibles with sticky notes. Place the Bibles in different open areas. Invite your child to "hurry" to each Bible like a scavenger hunt. Each time you arrive at a Bible, open it and say the Weekly Verse: "Mary wrapped Jesus in cloth and laid Him in a manger. Isaiah 7:14."

LOOK at Manger Scenes

Call your baby's attention to manger scenes as you see them in your home or while you are out. Point out Mary, Joseph, and Baby Jesus. Tell your baby that Jesus was born as God planned. Allow your baby to touch and hold the figures, if appropriate, as you talk. Play or sing familiar Christmas carols. Thank God for sending Jesus.

Mary, Joseph, and many other people went to Bethlehem.

Joseph found a place where Mary and he could rest.

Soon, Baby Jesus was born.

Mary gently wrapped Baby Jesus in soft cloths to keep Him warm.

She laid Baby Jesus in a manger. A manger is a feeding box for animals.

An angel (messenger from God) told the shepherds in the fields that a special baby was born.

The shepherds hurried to see the baby.

The shepherds thanked God for the special baby named Jesus.

Jesus Was Born

BASED ON LUKE 2:1-20

WEEKLY VERSE: Mary wrapped Jesus in cloth and laid Him in a manger. *Luke 2:7*

LIFE POINT: Jesus was born as God planned.

Mary and Joseph had to go to
Bethlehem, Joseph's hometown, to
be counted. Bethlehem was crowded with
people, and Mary and Joseph could not find a place to stay.
They finally found a place where they could rest.

Soon Baby Jesus was born. Mary wrapped the baby in soft cloths and laid Him in a manger. (A manger is a feeding box for animals.)

In fields nearby, shepherds were watching their sheep. An angel appeared and said, "Do not be afraid. I have good news for you! A baby was born in Bethlehem. He is God's Son. You will find Him lying in a manger." More angels appeared and praised God.

After the angels left, the shepherds decided to go to Bethlehem. They found Baby Jesus lying in the manger, just as the angel had said. The shepherds told everyone what they had seen and heard. They praised God for Baby Jesus.









God sent angels to tell the shepherds the good news! They were the first to hear that Jesus was born just as God had promised.

A Savior's Birth

LUKE 2:1-20

When it was almost time for Mary's baby to be born, Caesar Augustus, the emperor, commanded the people to be counted in their hometowns. That meant Joseph and Mary had to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. King David was born in Bethlehem hundreds of years earlier, and Joseph was from King David's family.



Outside the city a group of shepherds were in the fields at night, watching over their sheep. Suddenly, an angel appeared before the shepherds, and a bright light shone all around them. The shepherds were terrified!

The angel told them to not be afraid. The angel claimed to have good news that would bring great joy to all people! "Today in Bethlehem, a Savior was born for you!" the angel said. "He is the Messiah, the Lord! You will find the baby wrapped in cloth and lying in a manger."

Just then, many angels appeared and praised God saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven and peace on earth to people He favors."

When the angels left, the shepherds did, too! They said, "Let's go to Bethlehem right now and see what has happened!"

The shepherds hurried to Bethlehem and found Mary, Joseph, and the baby who was lying in a manger. The shepherds were excited and told everyone they met about the baby. The people who heard the shepherds were amazed at what they said. As the shepherds left, they praised God for everything they had seen and heard.

Mary remembered everything that had happened and thought about it often.
