MAKE a Puzzle

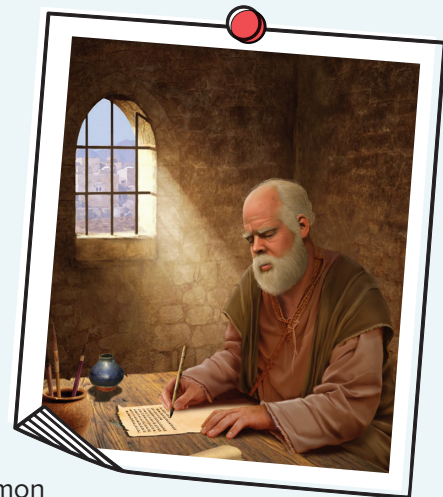
Dear Philemon,

I am writing this letter for my new friend, Onesimus. He has learned about Jesus. I am sending Onesimus to see you. I am asking you to treat him like he is a member of your family. Keep praying for me. I hope to see you soon.

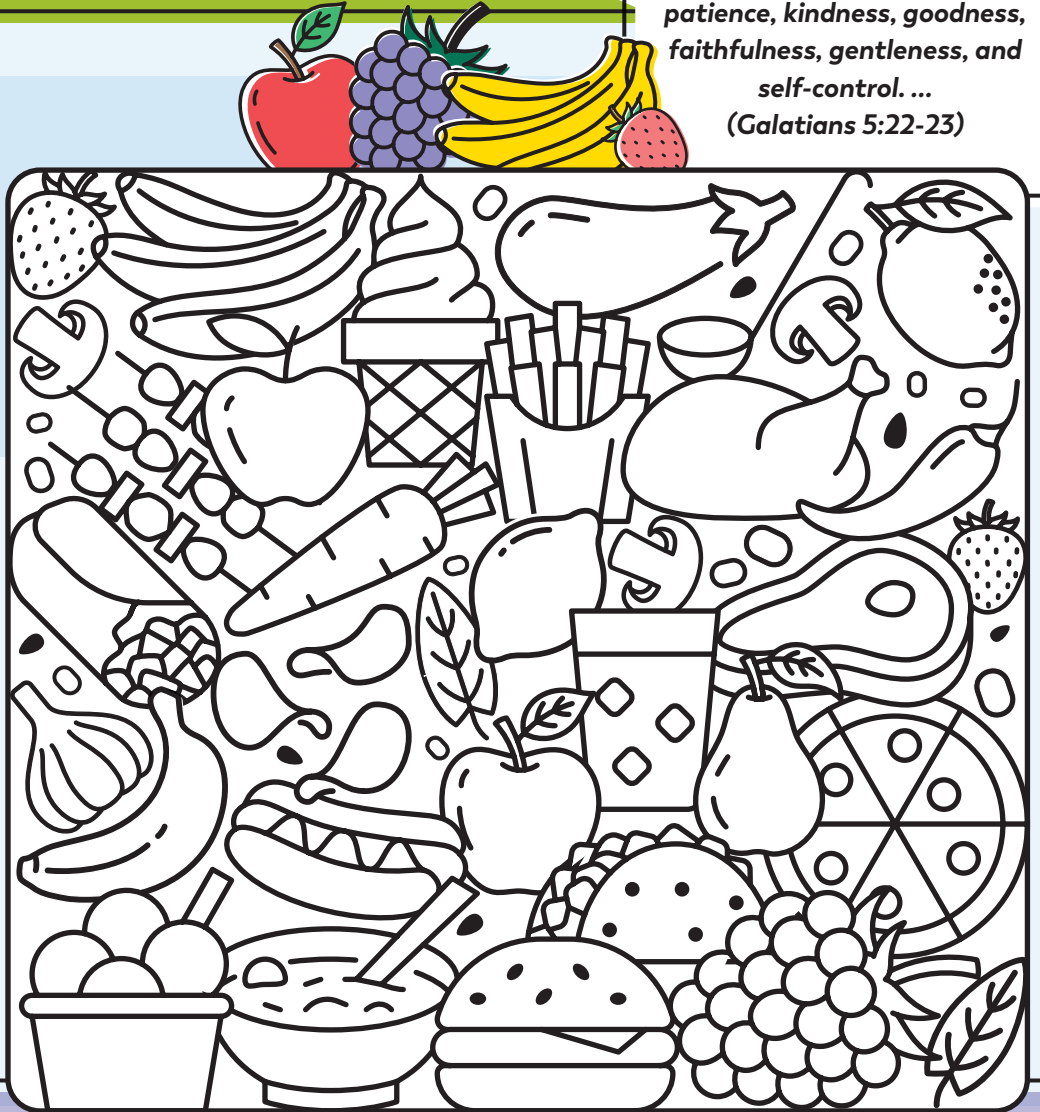

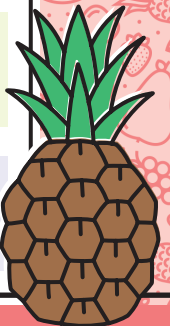

Fruit of the Spirit

GALATIANS 1:1-9; 5:13-6:10

Paul was a missionary who wrote a letter to the churches in Galatia. Some of the people there were preaching untrue things about the gospel of Jesus. Some believers were turning away from what Paul had been teaching about how to become a Christian.

Paul taught the Galatian Christians that it is important to love others and help them. Paul reminded the believers that they should love their neighbors as they loved themselves.

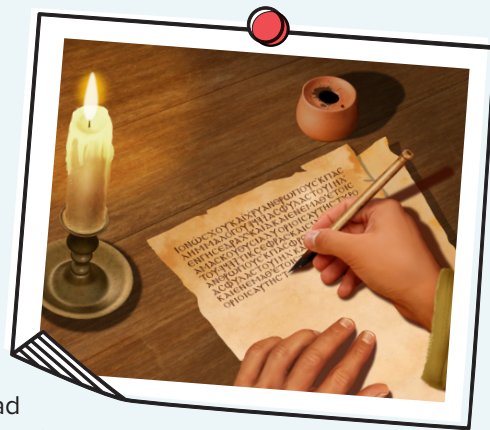
Paul explained that God changes people who trust in Jesus. God gives them the Holy Spirit, who helps them and gives them power to become more like Jesus.

Paul wrote, "If you let the Holy Spirit guide you, you will not do what you want to do. You will do what God wants. People who only choose what they want will be filled with jealousy, hatred, anger, fighting, bad choices, wrong thoughts, and other actions that are sinful and do not honor God. Those people will not be a part of God's kingdom."

Paul taught that the Holy Spirit helps people to live and show love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Paul called these the fruit of the Spirit. When Christians let the Holy Spirit be their helper, the results are the fruit of the Spirit.

Paul wrote more in his letter to Christians living in Galatia. He said: "Help one another. Don't think you are more important than others. Don't get tired of doing good. Work for the good of everyone, especially those who believe in Jesus."
