Some community partners have projects around their facilities that they feel like they're never going to get to. Some people need access to healthy food.

The people of CTK are committed to meeting these needs in partnership with over 30 local nonprofits. How? **Through the CTK Blessing offering and the ministries it funds.** Together we stand in the gap to bless our neighbors and the nonprofits who serve them.

Response Teams

The Response Teams ministry is focused on responding to the practical needs of our community partners. But we aren't just throwing people at a project. One of the most important aspects of Response Teams is the unique opportunity to express our faith and our hope, putting the love of Christ into action.

The goal with Response Teams is to come alongside our partners and the work they are already doing in the community. We want to meet their specific needs and let them be the experts while we are the hands and feet supporting them. Often, our projects help create space and ease the burden of lingering projects, enabling our partners to focus on the important work they are committed to. Filling the gaps is our specialty!

As an example, read what the head of the Boys & Girls Clubs had to say:

"I was able to visit both the Club and Early Learning Center in Ferndale and they both look so refreshed! We value that CTK has lightened the load for our maintenance man, Aaron. He is such a dedicated member of our team who takes pride in our facilities, but as a one person department, he can't always get everything done.

The CTKers who came to help could have made so many other choices about how to spend their time on a beautiful Saturday morning, I am so grateful that they chose to spend it making our space safer and more welcoming."

Sharing our Building with Community Partners

Being a good neighbor means welcoming others into our home. That's why CTK shares the building God's given us with several of our community partners. This makes it possible for them to offer services they couldn't afford in another location. Rather than recreating the wheel or becoming direct service providers, we look for ways to leverage

what we have to expand what our partners can offer the community. Here are a few examples:

Blue Skies Back-to-School Boost

For years, Blue Skies for Children has connected homeless, low-income and foster kids with back-to-school necessities like backpacks, warm coats, shoes and more! This past July, CTK hosted Blue Skies' annual Back-to-School Boost where hundreds of families got essential clothing and supplies for the upcoming school year.

Good Friends Club

We lease 2 classrooms at no cost to Dementia Support Northwest so they can keep the cost as low as possible for members of their caregiver respite program. Loved ones with dementia spend several hours engaged in therapeutic, fun activities while family members run errands, go to their own appointments and get just a bit of a break.

Kids In Motion

This dedicated group of physical, occupational and speech therapists see their clients in an Adventureland classroom we converted to pediatric therapy space. Major developmental milestones – like rolling, crawling and walking – have "windows of opportunity" that come and go very quickly. Meeting these windows is the only way to ensure all children grow to reach their fullest potential. Sharing the space with CTK allows Kids in Motion to have a larger area to support children and use equipment they can't take on home visits.

Bellingham Food Bank

Every Tuesday afternoon, our parking lot transforms into a drive-through food bank. The Bellingham Food Bank has used CTK as their weekly North Bellingham distribution spot for almost 9 years now. God placed us here as a central location on the north end where lots of families live in nearby apartments. This year, an average of 520 families each week stream through our parking lot to pick up a box of food.

World Relief English Language Classes

Refugees and other immigrants arriving to the U.S. come with a wide variety of educational and linguistic backgrounds, but all share the desire to thrive in their new home. Learning English — a gateway to life in the U.S. — is a critical part of this journey. Monday-Thursday mornings a group of students can be found in an upstairs classroom at CTK learning to read, write and speak basic English. We love the chance to meet people from nations all over the globe as they come and go to class!

CTK Food Share & Farm

Local food banks tell us the needs are rising steadily over the last few years. Our Food Share ministry works to adapt to the need as it grows and changes shape. Each year, our team oversees the planning and daily tasks needed to grow about 50 tons of produce, collect thousands of non perishable items and business donations, then drive that food all over Whatcom County to our 32 different partner locations.

Here are some new ways we've been impacting our community:

- Over 200 students came to the farm to learn about what we do and interact with us, each in unique ways.
- Our partners have sent us teams of people to help work in the fields, connect with our team, and join us in prayer. It's been wonderful to see the outside community engage with us in new and meaningful ways.

Since this ministry began, we hoped that our impact would come through not just the food we share but also the people living out their faith. Ultimately our work is our testimony, and the community is noticing!

Welcome Kits

Refugees and asylees often flee their homes at a moment's notice. Welcome Kits provide the basic household items people need as they resettle here in Whatcom County.

During Blessing Month (November), we will be collecting items to build kitchen kits for newly arrived families. These include things like pots, pans, utensils, garbage bags, mixing bowls and more. Can your small group build out a whole kit? Could your family fundraise or engage your neighborhood or your child's classroom to build a kit? Focus area: Maasai people group, widows, orphans, single mamas' sewing group, children's ministry, medical outreach, serving the vulnerable in love.

In Arusha, Tanzania we partner with a local YWAM Base where there is a vast
