A Note from Grant Fishbook LEAD TEACHING PASTOR



Growing up in Manitoba, Canada, winter meant ice skating, icicles, layers of warm clothing, sunshine, frigid temperatures, snowballs, warming

up your car before you drove, scraping windshields, long underwear, mittens, snowmobiles, firewood, hot soup, toques (not the chef type!), sun dogs, frost, snow and short days and long, dark night.

Living in Whatcom County, winter means a lot of things. It means rain, and also rain. And don't forget rain... and *more rain!*

What encourages me about this long gray season of rain is that it leads to the most brilliant types of green throughout the year. My late African brother John Mukolwe used to say, "I never knew there were so many shades of green until I came to Washington!"

While the rain may be a challenge for many, it can be helpful to remember that rain makes possible a beauty that we get to enjoy all year long.

My prayer for this season is that we capitalize on winter and do the hard work of laying the groundwork for another time of spiritual planting and harvest to come. There is purpose in every season.

I'm excited for our winter sermon series, Encounters. One of our

promises at CTK is that we will do everything we can to help you encounter the real Jesus. I believe there is no better place to encounter Jesus, in his fullness, than in the biblical accounts of his deep connection and interactions with real people. This winter, we are going to meet Jesus in a new way as he walks, talks, heals, challenges, and delivers people just like you and me.



In Magdala, Israel, there is a breathtaking mural by Daniel Cariola titled simply, "Encounter". It depicts the encounter between Jesus and the woman with the "issue of blood". 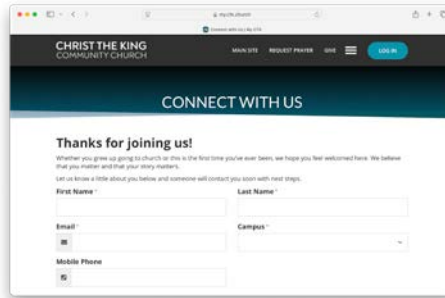
All throughout the Bible you read stories of people gathering around the table. On the first Sunday of March, join us after the 11:15 service for a good old fashioned church potluck!

Young Adults Apprenticeship

Formed for Relationships

To live a deeply formed life as followers of Jesus, we must know our loving Father, live as Jesus did, and be led by the Holy Spirit. As we grow in relationship with these three persons of the Trinity, we also come to understand ourselves more fully—freeing us to love others as we love ourselves. Since relationships are central to how we express this love, learning to cultivate healthy connections is essential.

That said, meaningful relationships aren't easy. Past wounds, unhealthy role models, fears, and anxieties can make connection feel risky. In this 10-session series, we'll explore what it looks like to build healthy relationships rooted in our identity as God's image-bearers.

The series will begin with two weeks each on God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. We'll then spend two weeks discussing why relationships matter, followed by two weeks offering practical tools grounded in Scripture and insights from leading research to help us navigate them well.

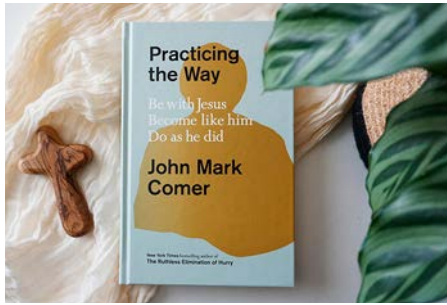

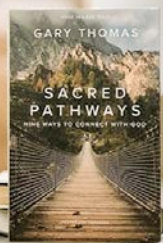

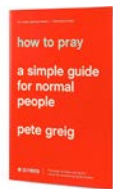

Let us introduce our 3 new community partners!

New opportunities to tangibly share the love of Jesus in Whatcom County

We began our current local missions strategy back in 2016 with 8 well-respected, effective, innovative, and stable nonprofits. Two things you may not know about our community partnerships: first, they are carefully chosen based on cultural fit, viability, mutuality, capacity, spiritually aligned or neutral, and working in one of our

five areas of focus (Kids & Families, Homelessness, Survivor Support, Disabilities, or Hunger Relief).

Second, we approach partnerships as a long-term commitment, learning more each year about one another's organization, mission, and needs. Through the years, our deepening relationship allows us to collaborate

in new ways, improve on current ideas, and respond to new challenges together. Our longest standing partnerships are with Lighthouse Mission Ministries and Whatcom County Pregnancy Clinic.

In 2025, we're excited to be adding three new community partners:



Road2Home will be our third partner serving those experiencing homelessness. Specifically, their Gardenview tiny home village on Lakeway and Woburn serves seniors and those with medical complexities. Their Volunteer Ally Program, providing vital social connections and reducing stigma, pairs a guest with a friend from the community for weekly visits. Look for opportunities to share a meal with Gardenview residents throughout 2025.



New Way Ministries is the newest partner in our survivor support category. Their transitional living facility in Lynden houses up to 25 families who may be struggling with addiction, domestic violence, human trafficking, or a crisis pregnancy. They provide care and counsel in a loving Christian atmosphere as they work with families to find stable, permanent housing, dependable income, and encourage loving, safe parent/child relationships. We plan to partner with Whatcom Dream in providing financial literacy classes on-site and also hope to send a Response Team out this summer to do some work on their newly remodeled space.



AHA Childcare is a Christian-based licensed daycare in Ferndale serving ages 1-5. They supplement their excellent work with kids by supporting families in a host of other ways. CTK Ferndale will be taking the lead on this partnership, with the rest of our network of churches right behind them. Expect to see diaper drives, adopt-a-family programs, and much more as we develop this relationship.

Join the Response Team Leadership

Pair your passion with purpose to bring hope to our community

What do you already care about? Maybe you have a heart for those experiencing homelessness. Maybe you long to see children have safe, vibrant places to learn and grow. Maybe you want to see your community look different tomorrow than it does today. We all care about something already, but the question is, what are you doing in response?

CTK's Response Teams Ministry is

focused on responding to the practical needs of our community partners. But we aren't just throwing people at a project. One of the most important aspects of Response Teams is the unique opportunity to express our faith and our hope, putting the love of Christ into action.

Imagine what we could accomplish in our community and the ways we could put our faith into action if we

grow our team. Imagine what would happen if you take what you already care about and what you already know and put it into action. The question remains, what are you doing in response to how God has uniquely equipped you?

In order to keep up with the needs of our community partners, **we are looking to fill additional roles on the Response Teams Leadership Team:**

Project Coordinator (1-2 needed)

Project Coordinators scope out all the logistics of a service project meeting with the community partners and visiting the work sites. A Project Coordinator also coaches and develops project leads in the areas of logistical, relational, and spiritual.

This role is well suited for someone with a background in project management, people management, or asking all the detailed questions.

Recruiter (1 needed)

Recruiters focus on engaging with people and connecting volunteers to projects. A Recruiter is highly relational and engages with others to recognize their different skills and capacities they bring to the Response Teams Ministry.

This role is well suited for someone who is curious about others, hearing others' stories, and connecting others to projects.

Project Lead (2-3 needed)

Project Leads execute the day-of project coordination. A Project Lead is the primary facilitator for volunteers serving on a project.

This role is well suited for someone who is passionate about engaging others and connecting with them relationally. This role is also well suited for someone with a high aptitude for problem solving and task delegation.

Italy for Christ, CTK Global Partner

Get to know Guy and Sondra Sottile and their ministry throughout Italy

“OUR MISSION has always been to add value to others and help them discover salvation in Jesus and personal growth in the kingdom of God,” explain Guy and Sondra Sottile, Founders and Leaders of Italy for Christ (IFC).



As a result of the ministry of Italy for Christ, countless numbers of people have come to the saving knowledge of Jesus! Churches have been planted and organizations reflecting a spirit of service have been launched by emerging leaders who are mentored by Guy and Sondra’s teachings and training programs.

“When you look behind the scenes and see that your leaders are leading the way, you know that the ministry is healthy and strong!” says Guy. “When we talk about a servant spirit, we talk about serving to multiply. We are talking about investing in the next generation because we realize that one is too small of a number to do great things.”

Guy and Sondra’s faithfulness in raising up young leaders is multiplying the ministry. The following are examples of God at work through IFC and its leaders.

Naples, Italy Franklin Graham was hosted by IFC, where 21,000 people gathered, representing the largest gathering ever of evangelicals in Italy!

Brindisi, Italy Fabio created an innovative outreach to the community with the motto of “Belong then Believe”. This approach includes offering value to the community through

an after-school program, which includes tutoring, English, art and music lessons. They also invite the community to participate in a talented gospel music choir, culminating in a Christmas concert, teaching music classes in schools, and



computer classes in prisons. In everything they do, they seek to create belonging with the goal of sharing the love of Jesus that leads to believing.

Catania, Sicily Francesco is pastoring and planting churches plus running a food distribution program and Community Center, caring for both the physical and spiritual needs of his neighbors.


Rome, Italy Jubilee 2025; Once every 25 years the Roman Catholic church opens a special door in 4 main cathedrals with the belief that if you walk through the door, you are relieved of the punishment for your sin. IFC is planning a massive “Forever Open” outreach to the 40 million pilgrims expected to travel to Rome throughout the year with the message that in Jesus, the door to forgiveness is always open.

“After 40 years of faithful service, it is a real joy seeing our young leaders reaching targets greater than ours and this proves the real value of a ministry!” says Guy.

Pray for the continued multiplication of the ministry of Italy for Christ, so more people will be reached with the love of Jesus and lives transformed!

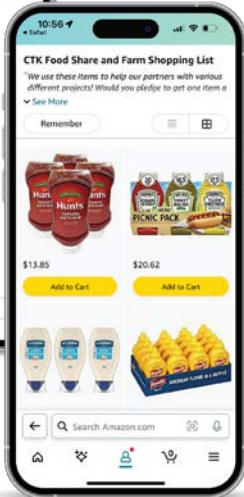
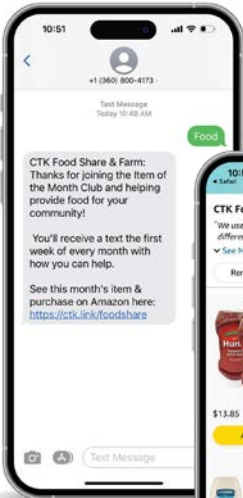

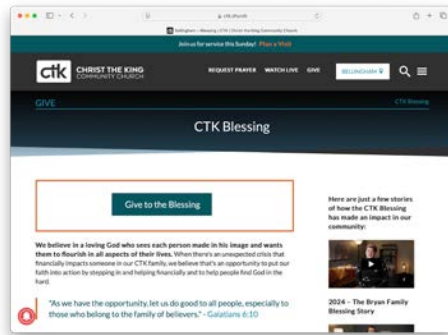

- Support our community partners financially

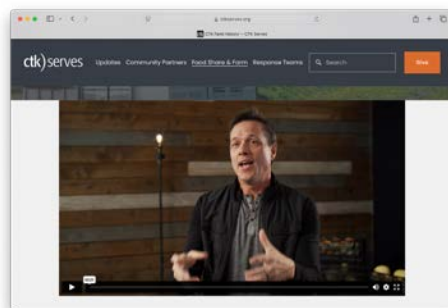

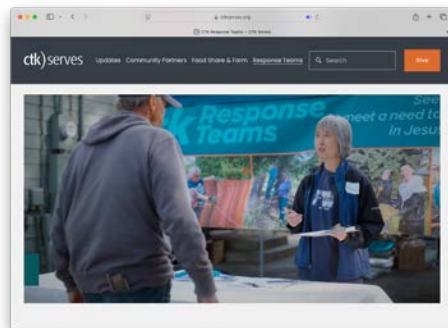

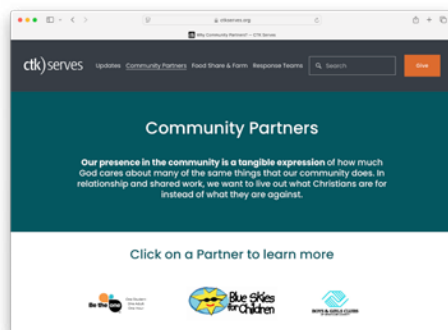
