


CHRISTMAS SERMON SERIES

Advent invites us to slow down, pay attention, and make room for the hope Christ brings. This reading plan is designed to guide us through Scripture as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus, reminding us of the hope, peace, joy, and love he offers. Start reading on Sunday, November 30.

Hope

Hope in Advent is rooted in God's faithfulness to fulfill his promises throughout history. Hope in Scripture is a confident expectation rooted in God's faithfulness—not wishful thinking. Because God keeps his promises, believers can endure trials, find renewed strength, and look forward with joy to eternal life in Christ.

Peace

Peace in Advent focuses on the true peace that only Jesus, the Prince of Peace, can offer us. Biblical peace is more than the absence of conflict—it's wholeness, security, and calm that come from God's presence and rule. Joy
