A Note from Grant Fishbook LEAD TEACHING PASTOR



Last summer, Laurel and I purchased a greenhouse kit. I painstakingly put it together (who knew a greenhouse could have so many parts!), and because

it was far beyond the sprouting season, we enjoyed its look, but not its benefits until fall.

In the late fall, we moved some of our plants and planters into the structure in hopes of nursing them through the winter. I watered occasionally, but in large part, forgot about them. Just last week, I walked into a greenhouse full of limp, brown plants. Apparently, I have a lot to learn about the benefits of this structure! I'm hoping spring brings revival and that as the plants move outdoors, life will begin anew!

the winter season with a focus on the process of personal spiritual growth. We are going to extend the "Jesus and Me" series throughout the spring because I can't think of a better theme of deepening our connection with Jesus. It promises to be personal, fun, and highly practical.

We'll kick off our spring ministry season with a huge celebration of Easter Resurrection power! Jesus was not just buried... he was planted and came back to life to open the door to our salvation! Easter, baptisms, new life, and new growth are all a part of our spring plans.

A Note from Melonie Kemp NETWORK EXECUTIVE PASTOR



Dear Friends,
In Acts 1:8, after the miracle of his resurrection, Jesus says to his disciples, “You will be my witnesses.” Most of us think of a witness

as someone who simply sees something happen. A witness observes an event and later describes what they saw. We witness sunsets, celebrations, accidents on the highway, and the quiet, ordinary moments of everyday life. In this sense, witnessing can feel passive. As bystanders, we notice what happens and remember it.

But Scripture teaches us that witnessing is something more. When Jesus tells his followers that they will be his witnesses, he is not asking them merely to report what they’re seeing in front of them. He is calling them to live out and share what they have experienced inside.

The disciples had walked with him, seen his compassion, heard his teaching, and encountered the hope of the resurrection. They were not only observers of these events, they were transformed by them.

To bear witness to God’s work is more than watching life unfold. It’s learning to recognize his presence in the midst of our daily lives. Sometimes that presence appears in quiet ways—strength during a difficult season; forgiveness and freedom where

bitterness once lived; peace in uncertain moments, or hope when our world feels chaotic. As we begin to notice these moments, they naturally become something we can’t help but share.

It’s not about having perfect words or giving a sermon. Often it’s simply telling the truth about our lives—how God met us in our fears, how Jesus shows up in the difficult moments, and how the Holy Spirit gives us comfort and strength when we need it most. When we share these stories, we are not just recounting events. We are pointing to the living God who is still at work in us and among us.

There are opportunities in this edition CTK Life to learn more about recognizing and naming God’s work among us (two great options below). This kind of seeing and sharing isn’t meant to be done alone. It happens as we listen to one another’s stories and walk together in faith. In community, we find the courage and language to bear witness to God’s grace among us and share it with the people around us.

So in this season of new life and growth, consider the invitation Jesus gives. Ask God to open your eyes to where he is working in your life and in the lives of those around you. The story you carry of God’s faithfulness and presence may be exactly what someone else needs to hear.

CHURCH-WIDE SERVICE PROJECT

Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive Sorting

May 9–18 • Location TBD

Based on last year's successful collaboration, we've been asked to team up again with Bellingham food banks and the Bellingham Postal Workers Union to sort the food donated at mailboxes all across Bellingham on Saturday, May 10. If you missed last year's drive, check it out at ctkserves.org/sorting.

For this year's drive, here's how you can help:

- No matter where you live, **spread the word!** During the first week of May, chat with neighbors as you're able and encourage them to give. If you have a shared mailbox, offer to drop off your neighbors' donations at the mailbox. Also, share CTK Bellingham's social media posts.
- **Get hyper-local!** This drive happens nationwide, but some communities lean into it more than others. We're sorting for the Bellingham postal workers, but if you live in other Whatcom County communities, call or stop by your post office and ask

how you can help during their Stamp Out Hunger drive.

- This year we decided to use this huge service project as an opportunity for groups who already gather to pursue Jesus together to also serve together. So if you're a part of men's or women's ministry, Response Teams, the Food Share & Farm team, a class this spring, worship team, youth group, a small group, or kids who attend children's ministry, you'll hear more in April about how to **serve at one of our sorting shifts**.
- Last year, 66,554 pounds of food was collected by Bellingham mail carriers and sorted by CTK volunteers. **If this year's donations break the all-time record of 70,000 pounds**, we'll celebrate that at church on Mother's Day and ask you to fill three additional sorting shifts to get the job done.

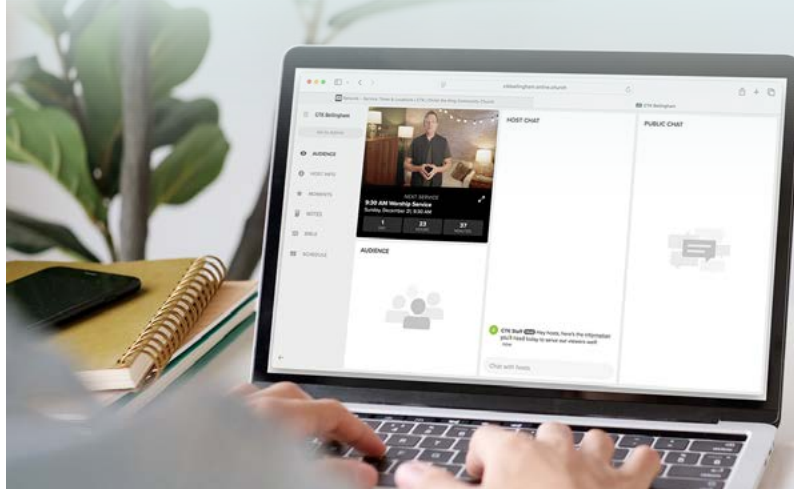

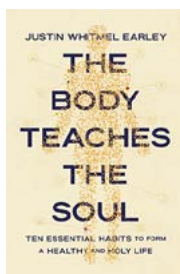

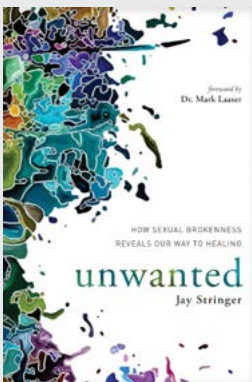

By the Work of Our Hands

As the growing season approaches, consider how you might join the team at the CTK Farm

The CTK Farm is entering its 19th season of growing food for hungry people in our community. As we took time this past winter to process with God what's next, one thought clearly stood out: God sees our efforts as worship to his name, and through our work he is becoming famous in Whatcom County. The very work our hands do is leading to open doors for us to speak about Jesus and show others that God cares about them deeply.

We would love for you to join us in the fields to help serve our community, not only for the good it does, but for the light it shines as we worship God together by the work of our hands.

This season we're looking forward to a new gleaning program (see sidebar) and hosting more groups out at the

farm. We're looking for a few folks who have the gift of hospitality or just love hanging out with kiddos to help us host field trips and Pick 'n' Picnics for all different ages. If that interests you or you'd like to find out more, scan the QR code or go to ctk.link/farmhost for more info.

Our work season starts in early May as we till the fields and transplant our starts into the soil. Be Part of Our New Gleaning Team

It's estimated that 30% of all crops grown in the U.S. are left unharvested in fields due to low market prices, labor shortages, or cosmetic standards. That's a lot of food going to waste!

During biblical times, God commanded farm owners to leave a portion of their crops to be gleaned for the poor in the land. Nowadays, gleaning not only prevents waste, but is a cost-effective way to get more produce into Whatcom County's food safety net.

In past years, we've organized gleaning teams for just a few crops. This year we believe God is calling us higher, to help rescue food from local farms and distribute it to food banks along with the food we grow and non-perishable goods you donate. HELP WANTED: Response Team Leaders

Our capacity to serve CTKers and Community Partners is determined by the number of leaders we have for projects. As seasons change, God invites previous leaders into new opportunities, which creates spaces for new leaders to take their place. Our current team consists of 6–8 Project Leads and 2–3 Registrars. This creates capacity for 4 project commitments this summer. The needs of our community are greater than the size of our current team. Here are the open positions:

Project Lead (6–8 needed)

A Project Lead executes the day-of project coordination. A Project Lead is the primary facilitator for volunteers serving on a project. This role is well-suited to someone who is passionate about engaging others and connecting with them relationally. This role is also well-suited to someone with a high aptitude for solving problems and delegating tasks.

Registrar (2–3 needed)

A Registrar is the administrative support on a project. The Registrar is a focused support role that helps ensure waivers are completed, supplies are curated, and food is provided. Are you detail-oriented or administratively gifted? Do you like working behind the scenes to help make things happen? This role is best suited to someone with an administrative background who knows how to communicate well and values supporting others.
