Greetings Mount Pleasant Family,

John, chapter 14 continues the discourse between Jesus and His disciples and begins with words of comfort for His disciples who were troubled because of what He said to them during their conversation in John, chapter 13 where Jesus identifies His betrayer and predicts Peter's denial.

Further in chapter 14, Jesus tells His disciples that He is going away to prepare a place for them and that He is the only way to the Father; reveals the Father; talks about answered prayer and promises another helper, the Holy Spirit, who will come from the Father and who will abide with them and will dwell in them forever.

In the theme scripture, verse 18 Jesus says to His disciples that they would not be as orphans, children abandoned and left alone because His presence will always be with them through the Holy Spirit.

Because I live, you will live also.". – John 14: 15 – 19 NKJV

On a very recent trip out of the country, I had the opportunity (and privilege) to walk around an old explosion site of an active volcano. The explosion site is over 200 years old, so time, weather, and millions of travelers walking around the site have caused some of the sediment and rock formations to smooth out. Therefore, when I walked up and down the "steps" of this site, I clung tightly to the single chain fence {see pics below}.



The fence was only helpful on parts of the path, but I was determined to climb up and witness God's great creation. Unfortunately, I got stuck in an area that was super slick and very far from the fence. I was immobilized and did not have the confidence to move, as people hurriedly walked back and forth up the "steps" passing me by. Thank God for this one woman who saw me. She saw my angst and reached out her hand and said, "Let me help you." As she guided my hand and helped me hold on, I was able to get past the place where I was stuck and move up to the peak! And to make it even better, the same woman helped me at the exact same spot on the way down. There was another person who helped me climb over a steep step when I got near the bottom. Thank God for angels in disguise!

So, what's the point? The point: God is always there. God arrives in places we don't deem possible and in ways we don't realize. Lacking confidence to step out on faith? HE reaches out HIS hand to support you. Not sure where to go? HE provides a guidepost for you to grab hold of. Feeling unseen? HE provides comfort and companionship when you least expect it. How is God able to do all of this? Through the Holy Spirit, of course!

Jesus points out in John 14, that He is the way, the truth, and the life. After which, He begins to talk about His alignment to God the Father and the Spirit of Truth. Jesus lays out the operation of the Triune God to the disciples from the viewpoint of a relationship with Him. "If you love Me, keep My commandments. And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever. "

Jesus made it a point that He was not working in a silo, but in fact, He had help to help us. Likewise, we are not alone in this world, even when it looks like we are. Jesus made sure we had help in all facets—through prayer, through connections with other people, and through the breath we breathe by way of the Triune God. God sees us. He hears Jesus for us. And He hears the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. There is no need to give up or feel hopeless. Jesus sees you in places you try to hide or where you seem stuck. No matter where we are and what we do, we can always declare the words of Hagar in Genesis 16: 13, "You are a God who sees me."

Just as with the Autumn winds, there comes a new refreshing rain God sent the season for fraying hearts to increase, grow, and gain.


The Autumn sun is slow to climb and dips much earlier into the night God sent the season for sleepy hearts to rise, shine, and unwind in His light.




