FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK...



(Galatians 5:1)

Greetings Mount Pleasant Family,

On the Apostle Paul's first missionary journey, he along with Barnabas established several churches in Roman provinces of Galatia. The truth of the Gospel of Christ had been told to the Gentiles by Paul. It wasn't too long after his missionary journey, in an attempt to discredit his apostleship and to change the doctrine he had taught, that some Jewish Christian teachers began spreading fake news (changes to the doctrine) to the Gentile Christians (converts). The Jewish Christian teachers were trying to bamboozle and hoodwink the Gentile Christians into believing that in order to be accepted as "true Christians" they needed to keep the Law of Moses and be circumcised as well. So, the Apostle Paul wrote this letter to the Galatians in fear that this fake news now being taught would jeopardize the salvation of those who would accept it.

In Galatians 5:1, Paul made it clear that there is freedom in Christ and the importance of living in that freedom; to stand firm in that truth and to not go back into slavery. The Gentile Christians were once enslaved to sin and now they were on the path to being enslaved by the law (the legalistic demands that salvation is earned through obedience to the law or by doing good works). Paul reminded them and reminds us today that salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone and in Christ alone.

Election Day - Tuesday, November 5

Important: Check to make sure your registration is up-to-date, and you know where to vote.

Virginia Voters: https://elections.virginia.gov

Deadline to Register to Vote is October 15, 2024



Deadline to apply for a ballot to be mailed to you: October 25, 2024. Your request must be received by your local voter registration office by 5:00 p.m.

First day of in-person early voting at local registrar's office: Friday, September 20, 2024.

The last day of in-person early voting: Saturday, November 2, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.

Election day polling places are open in Virginia from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

You may register to vote during early voting. Bring proof of address.



Deadline to request a mail-in ballot using online system is November 1, 2024.

Mail-in ballots must be postmarked or placed in a designated ballot drop box by 8 pm on November 5, 2024.

Early voting: Thursday, October 24, 2024 through Thursday, October 31, 2024 from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. You can vote early at any early voting center in the county you live in.

Election day polling places will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.

"Give Us, Us Free"

So Christ has truly set us free. Now make sure that you stay free, and don't get tied up again in slavery to the law. Listen! I, Paul, tell you this: If you are counting on circumcision to make you right with God, then Christ will be of no benefit to you. I'll say it again. If you are trying to find favor with God by being circumcised, you must obey every regulation in the whole law of Moses. For if you are trying to make yourselves right with God by keeping the law, you have been cut off from Christ! You have fallen away from God's grace. But we who live by the Spirit eagerly wait to receive by faith the righteousness God has promised to us. For when we place our faith in Christ Jesus, there is no benefit in being circumcised or being uncircumcised. What is important is faith expressing itself in love!" — Galatians 5: 1-6 NLT

"Give us, us free" are the famed words from the 1997 movie titled *Amistad*. These words come at a pivotal moment in the film as the leader of the slave revolt provides testimony about being illegally shipped from Africa. This movie, while loosely based on the true story of the Cuban cargo ship La Amistad in 1839, provides a soft insight in how slaves were acquired and transported during the transatlantic slave trade. Even after the slave trade was abolished in 1808, there were many countries, pirates, etc., who continued operations for another 100 years. Bondage is a very lucrative business for those who are bonding.

What if we aligned sin and the law to the slave trade? What if we aligned how we view freedom to how we view slavery in America? Would sin and bondage look so good then?

Imagine, you have this freedom in Christ and are living in a place called Peace, Love, and Joy (PLJ for short). Then a corporation has decided that you can no longer live in PLJ unless you speak Spanish. Even though there is no requirement to speak Spanish as you can speak whatever language you want in PLJ, you are arrested and carried away to a place called Bondage and Oppression (BAO for short). While in BAO, you find yourself doing everything you can to get back to PLJ. You learn to speak Spanish. You begin to adopt Spanish ways. You now only align your freedom to being Spanish; becoming a full resident of BAO and forgetting that you were simply trying to get back to PLJ – which doesn't require it.

This story is a common theme in all our lives. We are all trying to get to PLJ. However, we have been living in BAO so long that we wouldn't be able to identify PLJ on a map. This is the story of the Israelites in the Old Testament. This is the story of the Galatians. This is the story of you and me today. We are searching for freedom within the boundaries of our bondage. And it leads us to sin. It leads us to trust in constraints created by man.

When Christ died on the cross, He tore the veil between us and God. That's how we can get to these wonderful places of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Our freedom affords us a plethora of these things, no longer living in bondage because "Us is Free!"






