"Faith That Endures: Foundations That Last"

(Matthew 7:24-25) (NLT)

Saints of God, many of us are familiar with the saying, "*they don't make things like they used to.*" Whether it's a brand-new BMW, whereas soon as you hit the road, the low tire symbol appears, or the latest iPhone 17 that, despite the commercials, doesn't seem to handle calls as expected, even at fifteen hundred dollars, that's concerning. We're told each new model is better than the last, but today it feels like everything is designed with a built-in expiration date or a predetermined time to upgrade.

In contrast, Jesus assures us that, when it comes to our lives, He offers a blueprint for something truly *built to last*.

Jesus says, "*Anyone who listens to my teaching and follows it is wise, like a person who builds a house on solid rock.*" Notice, Jesus doesn't just emphasize *listening*. Listening alone won't keep your roof from leaking when life's storms arrive. We all know the difference between merely hearing and truly understanding noise. The distinction between hearing sounds and understanding them is that noise without comprehension remains simply noise.

Often, that's how we treat instructions from our spouses, parents, and even God's Word. Jesus calls us to *listen and follow*.

It's like actually reading and following the instruction manual (especially for my brothers) not just skimming it! Though, even then, following directions can be tricky. Anyone who's put together IKEA furniture knows that sometimes the bottom of the bookshelf ends up in the middle. There's a lesson there, too: we must always pay attention to who wrote the instructions and who is telling the story.

Life will bring storms—there's no warranty against that. Jesus doesn't say, "*If the rains come,*" but rather, "*Though the rain comes.*" The winds will blow, the waters will rise, and sometimes it may feel like you're living through a spiritual hurricane. Yet, Jesus reminds us in John 16:33b, "In the world you will have tribulation: but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." Despite the chaos—whether in the White House, Congress, or the Supreme Court—God, the Creator, has not abandoned those who trust in Him. If God built it, it will last, and there is no expiration date on His grace!

So, if your foundation is Christ, you may face setbacks, and sometimes it may seem that all hope is lost, but God's promises remain—every one of them is "yea and AMEN!" Our faith isn't meant to be a weekend DIY project; instead, it's an ongoing construction site where God is the master builder, and His Word is the blueprint. With Jesus as our foundation, we are not just temporary housing—we are a spiritual fortress with lasting appeal, built for eternity.

Today, take a moment to check your foundation. Is it built on the Rock, or are you just hoping duct tape and good vibes will hold it together? With Jesus, we are built to last, and no storm can change that.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for being our firm foundation. Help us not only to hear Your Word but also live it out, so that no storms in our lives can shake us from You. Amen.

ALL REGISTERED VOTERS IN VIRGINIA MAY VOTE EARLY, EITHER IN PERSON OR BY MAIL.

WAYS TO VOTE

RECEIVE A BALLOT BY MAIL

Request a ballot at elections.virginia.gov/absentee by 5 p.m., Oct. 24. You may return your ballot:

- By mail: postmarked on or before Nov. 4 and received by noon on Friday, Nov. 7.
- Before Election Day: to your voter registration office, drop-off location, or satellite voting location.
- On Election Day (by 7 p.m.): to your voter registration office, any polling place, or drop-off location.

**Since July 1, 2023, witness signatures are not required to vote by mail. You will need to provide the last four digits of your social security number and year of birth. If you do not have a social security number, you can provide your voter ID number instead.*

IN PERSON BEFORE ELECTION DAY

From Sept. 19 through Nov. 1: You can vote early at your local voter registration office or at a satellite voting location, if available. Bring acceptable ID. Find your local voter registration office: elections.virginia.gov/VRO

IN PERSON ON ELECTION DAY

On Tuesday, Nov. 4, 2025, vote at your polling place. On Election Day, polls are open from 6 a.m. until 7 p.m. Bring acceptable ID. Find your polling place: elections.virginia.gov/VoterInfo

Dates to Know

Sept. 19 - First day to vote early at your local voter registration office or satellite voting location. Find your local office: elections.virginia.gov/VRO

Oct. 24 - Last day to register or update your address to vote a regular ballot for this election

Voters may register in person after this date, through Election Day, and vote using a provisional ballot

Oct. 24 (by 5 p.m.) - Last day to request that a ballot be mailed to you

Oct. 25 (Saturday) - Local voter registration offices open for in-person voting

Nov. 1 (Saturday) - Last day to vote early in-person at your local voter registration office

Nov. 4 (Election Day) - Vote at your polling place. Polls are open 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

DEA Fentanyl Seizures in 2023

In 2022, DEA seized more than 59.6 million fentanyl-laced fake pills and more than 13,300 pounds of fentanyl powder. The 2022 seizures are equivalent to more than 397 million lethal doses of fentanyl.

The 2023 fentanyl seizures represent over 360 million deadly doses.*

75,600,000+ Millions of Fentanyl Pills Seized

11,503+ lbs. Pounds of Fentanyl Powder Seized

* 2 mg of fentanyl equates to a potentially deadly dose

Public Safety Alert

Laboratory testing indicates 7 out of every 10 pills seized by DEA contain a lethal dose of fentanyl.

DEA has seized a record 74.5 million fentanyl pills to date in 2023, which already exceeds last year's totals of 58 million pills.
