FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK . . .



(John 24:6-7)

Greetings Mount Pleasant Family,

During "Passion Week", the week prior to the resurrection of Jesus, a series of events happened. On Sunday (Palm Sunday), Jesus triumphantly enters Jerusalem as palms were laid before Him (Matthew 21:1-9). The day after that, He curses the barren fig tree (Matthew 21:18-19) and cleanses the temple (Mark 11:15-19). The day after that, Jesus' authority is questioned by leaders (Matthew 21:23-27). The day after that, Judas agrees to betray Jesus (Matthew 26:14-16). The day after that, He prepares to celebrate Passover (Matthew 26:17-19) and the Lord's Supper is instituted (Matthew 26:26-29). The day after that, Friday (Good Friday) Jesus was betrayed with a kiss by Judas (Matthew 26:48); falsely accused (Matthew 26:60-61; Matthew 27:12); beaten beyond human likeness (Isaiah 52:14); forced to wear a crown of thorns pressed down onto His head (Matthew 27:29); and forced to carry His own cross to Golgotha's hill until He became too weak and could not carry it any longer (Mark 15:21).

Jesus was ultimately crucified on a cross, bore our sins and paid our sin debt. He was put in a borrowed tomb and stayed there all day Friday, all day Saturday, but early the day after, on Sunday Jesus got up from the grave with all power in His hands. A day to rejoice!

Mount Pleasant, many members have experienced "the day after" consumed with grief and sorrow due to the loss of a family member. Prayerfully, they found solace in the fact that since Jesus was resurrected from the dead, their family members who were saved by grace through faith in Jesus will rise first to meet Him.

Let's continue to share the good news about Jesus with nonbelievers so that one day they too will come to know Him as their risen Lord and Savior, the One who gives eternal life.

Be encouraged, be blessed and continue to keep safe.

Guarding the Doors of the Sanctuary

"I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness." (Psalm 84:10 NKJV)

The history of ushering can be traced back to the very beginning of man's existence. God ushered in Light and called it *Day*. God also ushered Adam and Eve into the Garden of Eden with specific instructions. Other examples of the great beginning of Church ushers: Abraham ushered Faithfulness into the world, and he is called the Father of the Faithful (Hebrews 11:8-19); Moses ushered the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt (Exodus 12:31-37); and God Himself directed Moses in the wilderness of Sinai to organize the first great Usher organization (Exodus 19-20). The first great Usher organization was under the leadership of the Tribe of Levi as they were given direct instructions for the upkeep of the Temple (Numbers 3:5-10). They were to have the place of worship ready for the Priest to enter. They were to oversee all the vessels and any other things that belong to it. The Tribe of Levi also served as guards and protection for the Temple so that no one who was not allowed to enter could enter.



Likewise, the doors of the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church sanctuary are to be guarded at all times during Church worship services. There are seven specific occasions during worship service when no one is permitted to enter the sanctuary from either the vestibule or side doors. They are during:

- Prayer
- Scripture Reading
- Solos
- Anthems songs which have special importance for a particular group of people; an organization or a country, often sung on a special occasion, e.g., The Negro National Anthem during Black History Month celebrations.
- 5. Church Announcements
- Invitation to join the Church This is the time to bring those to Christ who are
 out of fellowship. Entering or exiting at this time is a distraction and may
 interfere with an individual's decision-making.
- Special Numbers Baptism, Ritualistic ceremonies, Liturgical dance or other performances.

During these occasions, one should cease all walking and talking. If assistance is needed at any time during the worship service, please signal an Usher. Be mindful of the volume of your voice; speak in a moderate tone while in any area of the sanctuary. During all worship services, follow the instructions of the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church Ushers.

"The Day After: Hope Rises with the Son"

"⁶ He is not here but has risen. Remember how He told you, while He was still in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." (Luke 24:6-7) (ESV)

Yesterday was a day of sorrow. The disciples, the women, and all who loved Jesus had spent the day before mourning His death. The cross was real. The pain was real. The burial was real. But today—the day after—is when hope begins to rise!

What do you do the day after tragedy? How do you move forward when the grave seems like the final chapter? This is where the resurrection power of Jesus turns the story around!

The angel's words, "He is not here, but has risen," shattered the despair of death. The enemy thought he had won. Sin believed it had conquered. Death assumed it had silenced the Savior. But on this day after, the truth emerged. Jesus had risen just as He said!

For us today, the "day after" represents the moment when we choose faith over fear. It is the moment when we remember that no trial, no suffering, no cross in our lives is the end of the story. Jesus walked out of the tomb, proving that every setback is a setup for a comeback.

Beloved, whatever you are facing today, know this: the tomb is empty, and hope is alive! You may have had your Good Friday of suffering, your silent Saturday of waiting, but today—your day after—is the day of victory. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is working in you (Romans 8:11).

The resurrection reminds us that God always keeps His promises. Jesus told His disciples in advance that He would rise, but in their grief, they forgot. Isn't that just like us? When we are overwhelmed, we forget what God has spoken over our lives. But just because we forget doesn't mean God fails. The promises He made still stand. When you feel like you are in a place of uncertainty, remember that the same God who raised Jesus is the same God who is working in your life. His plans for you are not finished.

So, lift your head. Dry your tears. Walk in the joy of resurrection power. Your Savior lives, and because He lives, you can face tomorrow with confidence. The day after is the day of new beginnings. Death has lost its sting, the grave has lost its victory, and Jesus reigns forever! Walk boldly into your future, because the risen King is with you! Amen!




