(Genesis 3:15) (KJV)

Greetings Mount Pleasant Family,

Genesis, chapter 3 describes the events that led to the fall of mankind that took place in the garden of Eden. The events are:

- The temptation (Genesis 3:1-5)
- The sin (Genesis 3:6)
- The punishment (Genesis 3:14-17)
- The expulsion from the garden (Genesis 3:22-24)

The fall of mankind, particularly the sin that was committed resulted in breaking the perfect relationship between God and humanity. But because of God’s compassion, He desired a restored relationship with mankind that would involve payment of a sin debt. 

"The Promise (The Protoevangelium or *First Gospel*)"

(Genesis 3:15) (KJV)

The term Protoevangelium—"the first gospel"—refers to Genesis 3:15, the Bible's earliest promise of a Messiah. After the Fall, God speaks to the serpent (Satan) and declares that the "seed of the woman" will one day crush his head, though the serpent will bruise His heel, pointing to Christ's suffering and ultimate victory over sin and death. This foundational verse introduces the ongoing conflict between good and evil, reveals God's plan for redemption, and offers humanity its first glimpse of hope—a Savior would come to reverse the curse brought on by humanity's disobedience, a promise fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Genesis 3:15 says, "*And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel.*" (NIV)

Where the Story Begins: Genesis 3:15 contains the very first whisper of the Gospel, the very *first promise* or *first gospel*. This verse seems difficult to understand, or even mysterious; but it represents the first promise of a coming Messiah or Anointed One. In this verse, God demonstrates His grace and mercy for mankind as well as His favor and judgment. God declares that there will be ongoing hostility between the serpent and the woman, and between their respective offspring. This is both a personal and spiritual conflict playing out even today in 2025, where the serpent symbolizes Satan, Eve embodies woman and humanity, and the enmity is the spiritual war between good and evil, darkness and light. Our faith allows us to endure this war to the end while also serving God and believing in Christ Jesus' life, death, and His resurrection. The reference to the *offspring of the woman*, the "seed", is profound because it points to a miracle birth, and a prophecy fulfilled in the *virgin birth* of Christ Jesus.

The good news is that Jesus has already defeated the serpent, gaining truth and light, and the keys to death and Hades. Genesis 3:15 reveals three ways God was in control of this ongoing struggle, through His divine judgment, sparing mercy, and redemptive purpose. *God's Divine Judgment* is seen in verse 12, where Adam makes an excuse and in verse 13 where Eve makes an excuse for their disobedience; however, God gave the serpent no opportunity for defense. God cursed the serpent before he cursed Adam and Eve. Adam and Eve hid in fear because they knew their punishment was death because of their sin against God. However, God showed mercy by holding back the death they both deserved. If God can forgive the first sins of disobedience, He can also show mercy to you if you turn from your sinful ways and trust in Christ Jesus. God's control is finally shown in *His Redemptive Purpose*, which was to restore humanity and all creation from sin. This plan, conceived before the world's creation, is fulfilled in Christ Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, and offers salvation and reconciliation with God for all who believe.

The Decisive Victory: Genesis 3:15 emphasizes the enmity between the serpent, the woman, and their offspring. Some see the bruised heel as the first advent, and the bruised head as the second coming. The crucifixion and resurrection of Christ were the decisive victory. Verse 15 refers to the *Heel-Bruising Crucifixion* and says, "You shall bruise his heel." The verb bruise means to strike or crush. The serpent

stalked the seed of the woman through forty-two generations; and struck the heel of Christ at the cross. The serpent's goal was to kill, not wound; but Satan lost at the bloody cross, not the empty tomb. Verse 15 also refers to the *Head-Bruising Resurrection* and says, "He shall bruise your head." The *serpent* will only *bruise* the offspring's heel. The *offspring* will *crush* the head of the serpent. John 19:30 says, "It is finished." God the Father places his stamp of approval on the finished work of Christ by raising him from the dead to crush the head of the serpent (now Satan is a defeated foe)! In 2025 we can trust and have faith in both God the Father and God the Son because: 1) The one who wrote the problem wrote the solution; 2) The one who wrote Genesis wrote Revelation; 3) The one who wrote the conflict wrote the victory; and 4) The one who wrote the First Adam wrote the Last and Greater Adam. Christ Jesus fulfilled and surpassed the role of the first man, Adam, who brought sin and death into the world. Today, Jesus offers us redemption and eternal life, which makes Him the ultimate representative for humanity.


