# **MONDAY - Departure Day**

- ALL CAMPERS NEED TO BE AT PARKWAY NO LATER THAN 9:15AM. WE WILL LEAVE PARKWAY AT 10:00AM.
  - · Campers will check-in at the registration table.
  - Campers will receive and should change into their yellow Parkway Kids shirts.
  - Girls' Luggage and Boys' Luggage will be separated into respective zones.
  - All Medications should be turned into Mark VanDerHyde at the medical table.
  - All monies should be given to your camper's CHAP for safe keeping.

Parents/Families are encouraged to stay and see us off. We will have a prayer time before we leave. Once we pray, campers will board the bus(es) and we will be on our way!

• We will be stopping in Roanoke Rapids, NC for lunch.

- We plan to arrive at camp between 1:30-2pm. Parents can stay updated via REMIND.

# **FRIDAY - Return Day**

- We should leave camp by 11am and return to Parkway around 2pm. A more accurate time will be texted to parents as we get closer to home.
- We will be stopping at the Food Court in Southpark Mall (Colonial Heights) for lunch.

- Once we return to Parkway, campers should ensure they have ALL of their belongings from the top of the bus, and underneath. The bus will depart shortly after dropping us off.

# Rules & Policies

- Follow the camp schedule! (All campers must attend all activities and be on time).
- Everyone MUST eat ALL meals! (Chaps will be monitoring this) DRINK LOTS OF WATER!
- Except while in bed or in pool, campers must wear name tag at all times.
- Campers must never be alone. Campers must travel in groups of at least THREE at all times!
- All campers must abide by all *Light Out* curfews! No "sneak outs," unsupervised hikes, raids on other rooms, etc. Anyone caught outside their room (unless using the restroom or seeking the help of a chap for an emergency) without permission after "lights out" *will be sent home* at the parents expense.
- Boys' rooms are blue. Girls' rooms are pink. There are NO PURPLE ROOMS.
  - The boys' rooms are OFF LIMITS to girls and the girls' rooms are OFF LIMITS to the boys.

    \*\*Campers will be sent home for any violation of this guideline with no questions asked!\*\*
- Be respectful of campus property! Parents will be held *financially liable* for any damage to rooms/property, including broken lamps, beds, fixtures, lost keys, etc.
- Always carry your Bible and Camp Student Book to worship and small group time (It is recommended that campers bring a drawstring bag or backpack for the week).
- Modesty is policy for both guys and girls.
  - No spaghetti straps, crop tops, or tank tops. Do not dress in a way that calls attention to undergarments (off shoulder tops, sagging pants, etc.) Guys will wear shirts at all times.
  - Shorts must not ride or roll down to show your belly button, and must be long enough that when hands are extended to the side, finger tips must touch fabric. We must be able to see your shorts underneath your shirt (i.e. oversized t-shirt must be tucked in).
  - No yoga/leggings/spandex pants are to be worn outside of the rooms.
  - Clothing must not represent offensive or inappropriate subjects. (see packling list for examples)
     \*\*CHAPS have the right to ask you to change if your clothing is deemed inappropriate.\*\*
- **NO electronics** are to be brought to camp! This includes phones, tablets, Ipods, and everything else. If these items are brought, they will be taken and given back at the end of the week.
- Treat each other, all adults, facilities, and yourself with respect.

#### • 3 Strike Rule

### **Things To Not Bring:**

- ALL ELECTRONIC DEVICES such as:
  - Cell phones, iPods, tablets, game systems, etc.
- SNACKS We have severe allergies amongst our campers and can not allow outside snacks to be brought on this trip. Don't worry. We will have safe snacks available for all our campers!
- Inappropriate/immodest clothing
- **Stuff you DON'T NEED** (If you can live without it for 5 days, leave it at home.)
- Jewelry

- Guns/Knives/Weapons
- Fireworks, Sparklers, Firecrackers, Lighters, and/or Matches
- Any Tobacco or e-cig/vape products
- Alcohol

\*PLEASE NOTE: Any forbidden items will be confiscated immediately and returned to parents after we arrive back at the church.

# I have a question



#### What is OMC?

OMC is our favorite game at CentriKid Camps! OMC stands for Organized Mass Chaos. It happens in the afternoon of the last full day of camp.

Every camper will compete for their color team by completing task cards. Every player is trying to complete a different task, but the biggest rule of the game is that you can't say "no." So every time a camper asks another for help, they must stop their task and help.

After a camper completes the task, they turn it in for a point. The team with the most task cards in their bucket wins! While adults don't complete cards, they still help kids with tasks, take pictures, help in the No Fly Zone, and get very \*messy. \*Messy at OMC means you're covered in shaving cream and soaked from water balloons!

# How does my child get to Bible study and tracks?

We take safety very seriously. Your kids will dismiss from the auditorium for Team Time (Bible study and Recreation). They will meet at The Spot, our central meeting place for Track Times.

### How will mail at camp work?

We recommend sending your letters with your Group Leaders or in your campers' luggage!

# What about camp t-shirts?

Every participant at camp will get a "Wow Factor" t-shirt during Check-In when we arrive at camp!

Our group will wear these shirts on the ride home!

# What is in the camp store this year?

Many items will be specific to a camper's team color so he/she can fully support their color team throughout the week. the Camp Store includes items like t-shirts, bracelets, water bottles, and more! Prices for store items will range from \$1-\$30. These items can be ordered at parkwayfamily.org/camp. Preorders must be in by May 24.

# How much free time will my campers have?

At CentriKid, almost every moment is scheduled. Campers have a few extra minutes around meals and about an hour at the end of the night. We have "Hang Time," which is time for leaders and the staff to hang out with your kids. There will be lots of Hang Time options that campers can choose to take part in.
