PASTORAL UPDATE

Once a month, a dozen of us gather in the upstairs meeting room to explore a different contemplative prayer practice. We are led by Peter Watkins, a spiritual director, who guides us through reflection and discussion on what we're learning from each practice. We are open about the roadblocks, challenges, and sticking points to each practice as well as what's working. Some resonate with us, some do not.

During Lent, it's a great time to practice prayer in some new ways. You may not have thought of these as prayer before, but I encourage you to try one and see what it feels like. Below is a brief summary of some practices we have been exploring. We've also prayed through silence, journaling, and the Examen Prayer. Feel free to contact me if you'd like more detailed information about any of the prayer practices.

Lectio Divina: Praying through Scripture

Find a comfortable position and take a few deep breaths. Pick a scripture (such as Psalm 42, Isaiah 9:1-6, Matthew 6: 25-34, John 15: 1-10, Philippians 2:1-11) and read it slowly, out loud or silently. As you read it, listen for a word or phrase that stands out for you. Reflect on that word or phrase. Read the passage again, listening for a word or phrase that reflects what God is saying to you today. Reflect on that word or phrase. Read the passage a third time, listening for a word or phrase that reflects how God wants you to respond. Reflect on that word or phrase. Express your gratitude to God for the experience.

Deep Listening: Praying through Listening to Others

Deep listening is a gift that is so similar to being loved that most people cannot tell the difference. When you seek to listen deeply to another person, try using evoking questions as you do. They are different from questions of fact—helping the person see a new perspective or come to a new awareness. Can you say more about that? What was that like for you? What images come to your mind when you think about this belief? In which situations do you feel most authentic? What help or support do you desire? Do not worry about what you will say in response. Receive their thoughts as a gift, just as your listening ear is a gift to them.

Loving Kindness Meditation: Praying through Loving Activism

This prayer begins with yourself and has you move towards people further away from you. You recite the same words for each person you are praying with and for. Beginning with yourself, recite these words: *May I be filled with loving kindness. May I be safe from inner and outer dangers. May I be well in body and mind. May I be at ease and happy.* Repeat them as many times as you need to. Think of someone for whom you love, recite the prayer. You keep praying this for others, moving to someone who is neutral, then someone who has irritated you, then someone who has hurt you. Lastly, you can cast the prayer out broadly to the world.

Neil's Story

Neil came to the food shelf after a long career and a lifetime of self-sufficiency. Nearing retirement he was diagnosed with cancer and needed help. Because of his illness, his ability to work was significantly curtailed, reducing his income. Because of that he couldn't keep up with all his bills. Neil came to ICA for help and thanks in part to your gifts, we have been able to provide Neil with the food he needs to make ends meet. And while that food support is critical, we also provided him with a listening ear and emotional support as he navigates his cancer treatment. Thank you for helping us care for neighbors like Neil!



Record Numbers of Neighbors Need Help

ICA is seeing record numbers of families visiting the food shelf. With over 1000 families visiting each month, our food stock is in constant need of being replenished. Traditionally the spring is a time when contributions of food and financial support begin to decline. In response ICA joins the hundreds of other food shelves in Minnesota to encourage contributions during March Food Share month. It's the second most important time of the year for food and financial contributions.

March Food Share Month Goals

To ensure we can continue to provide for neighbors like Neil we need a significant community response. You can make a difference by helping ICA collect 200,000 lbs. of food and \$300,000 during the month of March. You can bring your gifts of food to EUMC anytime during the month of March. And you can make financial gifts through EUMC or directly to ICA via their website. When you make a gift through ICA's website be sure to indicate that you are a member of EUMC.

Food, Jobs and Housing

It might also be helpful to know that ICA provides more than just food for our neighbors in need. We think of our services as encompassing: Food, Jobs, and Housing. In 2022 ICA helped more than 35 people find new employment. And we shared over \$300,000 in rental support to help keep families in their apartment housing.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

The Environmental Team is part of the Social Justice Ministry Team at EUMC. As stated in UMC's Social Principles, "All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings."*

Monday, April 22, is Earth Day with a theme of Planet vs. Plastic. This is the 54th year of this event, whose purpose is to encourage support and action for environmental protection and justice. EUMC will be hosting a variety of events/activities in April, beginning with an Environmental Justice Sunday on April 14. Buff Grace, Director of Faith Networks at Minnesota Interfaith Power and Light, will preach. Following the service, congregants can sign letters to state and national legislators asking for action on environmental issues.

On Family Sunday, April 21, children will be able to make seed kits from newsprint.

Monday evening, April 22, we will be showing two films, *Kiss the Ground,* a documentary about regenerative agriculture for adults, and *The Lorax*, for children. We all know that changes need to be made to prevent further environmental degradation and we should be part of that change.

FINANCE TEAM REPORT

Thank you for everything you do to support EUMC financially; every contribution matters and is appreciated! All gifts as well as progress on commitments (Operating and Capital) can be seen on your quarterly statement.

Operating Budget Update: The EUMC leadership team is finalizing the 2O24 budget, and as communicated during our church meeting on January 28th, we are projecting a budget shortfall of nearly \$88,000 for 2O24. The leadership team is evaluating all options to increase contributions and bring down costs; staff and facilities represent 80% of our projected budget. We will be utilizing dedicated funds and memorial funds, where appropriate, to bridge the gap between projected spend and projected contributions. The \$25,000 remaining balance of our rainy day "emergency" fund will only cover a portion of the projected budget shortfall.

Capital Campaign Update: We have now utilized all gifts received to date and have drawn on our credit facility. Any funds received going forward will be used to pay the final expenses and pay down our loan; completing contributions timely will help to reduce the ongoing debt service associated with our construction loan. Thank you again for your generosity!
