

Sermon: We Begin With The Gospel

from Romans 1.1-7

Doxology



Like last week, this week our readings focus almost entirely on one Psalm, Psalm 107. This Psalm is also "historical", but presents itself differently. Psalm 107 repeats a pattern. A section will start by describing "some" people by their experiences. "Some" ...

- wandered in desert wastes (v. 4)
- sat in darkness (v. 10)
- were fools through their sinful ways (v. 17)
- went down to the sea in ships (v. 23)

After their experience is described, "Then they cried to the Lord", vs. 6, 9, 13, 28. After the Lord responds to their cry comes the admonishment, "Let them thank the Lord for His steadfast love" vs. 8, 15, 21, 31. The pattern of Psalm 107 is one of people who live at a spiritual distance from God, acknowledge their folly or danger, cry out to God, God cares for them and God is praised.

I don't know about you, but that pattern sounds familiar.

Culture encourages us to live by the mantra, "I've got this." Whatever it is, regardless how difficult or the obvious result of our own poor decision-making, our pride is reinforced against asking for or receiving help: "I've got this."

No, you don't. Often "I've got this" means kicking the can down the road, applying short-term solutions to long-term problems.

Psalm 107 holds up a mirror to the illusion of the idol we most often worship: our independence; our lack of need for God. But we do need God. Really. We were made to need Him.
