The church's traditional "Call to Worship" on Palm Sunday points to **Psalm 118** and **Zechariah 9**. Matthew and John refer directly to Zechariah's image of the King who enters Jerusalem peacefully upon a donkey. All four gospels refer to **Psalm 118.26**, *"Blessed in He Who comes in the name of the Lord."*

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week. On Palm Sunday again, traditionally, much has been made in churches of the children's involvement in waving Palms. It's a nice moment, or can be; the children tend to like it and it's 'harmless'. The church mood on Palm Sunday, traditionally, is festive, joyful. After all, isn't the whole point the triumphant welcome given by the people to Jesus?

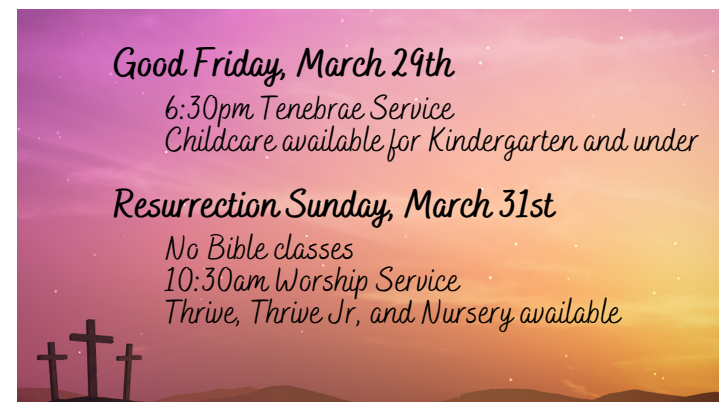
"Yes," but mostly, "No."

"Yes," there is genuine enthusiasm for Jesus. And "Yes," Jesus is the righteous King entering Jerusalem to deliver the kingdom of God. Certainly a cause for celebration!

But mostly, "No." For anyone who has been following Jesus to Jerusalem, the boisterous entrance borders on surreal. Jesus has been announcing with increasing specificity His arrival in Jerusalem will end in betrayal, torture, being handed over to others, being crucified ... and then rising from the dead. (Whatever that meant!)

Holy Week, if it is to be any kind of observance reflecting Scripture, demands self-examination. Jesus knowingly rode to His death ... to the cheers of the crowd. They didn't "get" that part of His ride.

I wonder, do we?
